§ 13-1. Definitions

14 15	(2) THE CREATION AND MONITORING OF SHORT TERM AND LONG RANGE PERFORMANCE GOALS;
16 17	(3) Approval and oversight of center yearly budgets prior to its submission to the Board of Estimates; and
18	(4) monitoring and oversight of centers relationship with the $BACVA$ .
19	§13-3. BOARD OF DIRECTORS- IN GENERAL
20	(a) Established
21 22	(1) The Board consists of not less than 9 members, and not more than 15 members;
23	(I)_EX-OFFICIO MEMBERS
24	(A) 1 MEMBER APPOINTED BY CITY COUNCIL;
25	(B) THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE OR DESIGNEE;
26	(C) THE MAYOR OR DESIGNEE;
27	(d) the President or designee of BACVA.
28	(II) ALL REMAINING MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE MAYOR AND CONFIRMED BY THE CITY COUNCIL.

1	(B) QUALIFICATIONS.
2	(1) EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD MUST BE:
3	(I) A RESIDENT OF BALTIMORE CITY; AND
4	(II) A PERSON OF ABILITY, RELEVANT EXPERIENCE, AND INTEGRITY.
5	(C) TERM.
6	(1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 3 YEARS.
7 8	(2) The terms of the members are staggered as required by the terms provided for the members first appointed to the Board.
9	(D) VACANCIES.
10 11	(1) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until his or her successor is appointed and qualifies.
12 13	(2) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until his or her successor is appointed and qualifies.
14 15	(3) Members may be appointed to succeed themselves. However, a member may not serve more than $2$ consecutive full terms.
16	(E) REMOVAL.
17 18	The Mayor or City Council President, as the case may be, may remove at will any member of the Board appointed by him or her.
19	(f) Compensation; expenses.
20	(1) A MEMBER MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION.
21 22	(2) THE BOARD MAY ESTABLISH RULES GOVERNING PAYMENT OF OR REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES INCURRED BY A MEMBER IN THE DISCHARGE OF HIS OR HER DUTIES.
23	§ 13-4. Board of Directors — officers; staff; delegation.
24	(A) Officers
25	(1) THE MAYOR DESIGNATES THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD.
26 27	(2) From among its members, the Board must select any officers that the Board determines.
28	(B) STAFF
29	The board may select staff as provided for in the ordinance of estimates.

1	§ 13-9. BOARD OF DIRECTORS — QUORUM; OPEN MEETINGS; PUBLIC RECORDS.
2	(a) Quorum.
3	Majority of members of the Board constitute a quorum.
4	(B) OPEN MEETINGS.
5 6	All meetings of the Board must be conducted in accordance with the State Open Meetings Act.
7	(c) Public records.
8 9	All records of the Board must be open to public inspection in accordance with the State Public Information $\operatorname{Act}$ .
10 11 12	<b>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
13 14	<b>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 <sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
