1 (c) The report shall include:

2 (i) a list of priority areas for CPTED implementation that is created using the
3 following:

4 (A) qualitative data, including interviews and safety audits;

5 (B) quantitative data, including crime statistics, crime maps; and

6 (C) an accounting for potential crime displacement;

7 (ii) a mode of incorporating CPTED principles into project development,
8 specifically projects that encourage revitalization of underutilized or vacant
9 public areas in close proximity to residential, commercial, and industrial areas,
10 and public parks, pocket parks, common areas, major intersections, and other
11 important public spaces;

12 (iii) a means to collaborate with public health professionals to examine and
13 propose uses for CPTED principles; and

14 (iv) a strategy to build upon existing community policing programs that are
15 appropriate and build trust with community members and community groups
16 in CPTED identified priority areas.

17 (d) The City Council shall call a hearing:

18 (i) where the Director of the Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Safety and
19 Engagement shall present the findings and recommendations of the report;

20 (ii) to which representatives from the Office of the State's Attorney for Baltimore
21 City and community groups will be invited to comment.

22 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the day it is
23 enacted.
