AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

**Decennial Fire and Emergency Medical
Services Redistricting Plan**

FOR the purpose of requiring the Baltimore City Fire Chief to prepare a Decennial Fire and
Emergency Medical Services Redistricting Plan; requiring the Fire Chief to present the Plan
to the Mayor and City Council; requiring the Plan to be approved by ~~resolution~~ ordinance of
the Mayor and City Council; allowing the Mayor and City Council to amend the Plan under
certain circumstances; and generally relating to redistricting the Baltimore City fire battalions
and emergency medical services districts.

BY adding

Article 9 - Fire Suppression and Prevention
Section(s) 2A-1 to 2A-3 to be under the new subtitle designation,
“Subtitle 2A. Decennial Fire and EMS Redistricting Plan”

(Edition 2000)

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Article 9. Fire Suppression and Prevention

**SUBTITLE 2A. DECENNIAL FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL
SERVICES REDISTRICTING PLAN.**

§ 2A-1. DEFINITIONS.

(A) *IN GENERAL.*

IN THIS SUBTITLE, THE FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law.
[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.
Underlining indicates matter added to the bill by amendment.
~~Strike-out~~ indicates matter stricken from the bill by
amendment or deleted from existing law by amendment.

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1 (B) *BATTALION.*

2 "BATTALION" MEANS A UNIT OF FIRE SUPPRESSION PERSONNEL THAT IS ASSIGNED TO A
3 GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION.

4 (C) *DEPARTMENT.*

5 "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE BALTIMORE CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT.

6 (D) *DISTRICT.*

7 "DISTRICT" MEANS A UNIT OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ("EMS") PERSONNEL
8 THAT IS ASSIGNED TO A GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION.

9 (E) *PLAN.*

10 "PLAN" MEANS THE DECENNIAL FIRE AND EMS REDISTRICTING PLAN ESTABLISHED
11 UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

12 § 2A-2. PLAN REQUIREMENTS.

13 FOLLOWING EACH DECENNIAL CENSUS OF THE UNITED STATES, THE FIRE CHIEF SHALL:

14 (1) REVIEW:

15 (I) DECENNIAL CENSUS POPULATION AND HOUSING DATA FROM THE UNITED
16 STATES CENSUS BUREAU;

17 (II) FIRE SUPPRESSION CALL VOLUME TRENDS;

18 (III) EMS CALL VOLUME TRENDS;

19 (IV) FIRE SUPPRESSION RESPONSE TIMES;

20 (V) EMS RESPONSE TIMES; AND

21 (VI) ANY OTHER INFORMATION DEEMED NECESSARY BY THE FIRE CHIEF;

22 (2) BASED UPON THE DATA SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SECTION, INCLUDE IN
23 THE PLAN STRATEGIES TO:

24 (I) ADJUST THE GEOGRAPHIC BOUNDARIES AND COMPOSITION OF EACH FIRE
25 BATTALION AND EMS DISTRICT; AND

26 (II) REALLOCATE THE RESOURCES AND PERSONNEL OF THE DEPARTMENT AMONG
27 THE BATTALIONS AND DISTRICTS; AND

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1 (3) PRESENT THE PLAN TO THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL WITHIN 1 YEAR FROM THE
2 ISSUANCE OF THE DECENNIAL CENSUS POPULATION AND HOUSING DATA BY THE
3 UNITED STATES CENSUS BUREAU.

4 § 2A-3. APPROVAL PROCESS.

5 (A) APPROVAL OF THE PLAN.

6 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, THE MAYOR AND CITY
7 COUNCIL MAY APPROVE THE PLAN BY ~~RESOLUTION~~ ORDINANCE WITHIN 180 DAYS FROM
8 THE PRESENTATION OF THE PLAN.

9 (B) AMENDMENTS TO THE PLAN.

10 THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS MAY AMEND THE PLAN BY ENUMERATING
11 ANY AMENDMENTS IN THE ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PLAN. ~~PROPOSE AMENDMENTS TO~~
12 ~~THE PLAN.~~

13 (1) ~~PRIOR TO PASSAGE OF THE RESOLUTION DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS~~
14 ~~SECTION; AND~~

15 (2) ~~WITHIN 180 DAYS FROM THE PRESENTATION OF THE PLAN.~~

16 ~~(C) APPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS.~~

17 ~~AMENDMENTS PROPOSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION BECOME~~
18 ~~EFFECTIVE ON APPROVAL BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE CITY COUNCIL.~~

19 ~~(D)~~ (C) EFFECTIVE DATE.


20 (1) A PLAN APPROVED UNDER THIS SECTION IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.

21 (2) IF THE PLAN IS NOT APPROVED WITHIN 180 DAYS AFTER PRESENTATION OF THE PLAN,
22 THE PLAN, AS ORIGINALLY PRESENTED BY THE FIRE CHIEF TO THE MAYOR AND CITY
23 COUNCIL, WILL GO INTO EFFECT.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day
25 after the date it is enacted.
