Re: City Council Bill 22-0094R - Approval for the Exchange of a Class B-D-7 License to a Class A-7 License - 1807-1811 Baker Street, 21217

City Council Bill 22-0094R, which was introduced by Councilmember James Torrence. If adopted, this resolution would allow for the holder of a Class B-D-7 Beer, Wine, and Liquor (BWL) license located at 1807-1811 Baker Street to apply to the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City (BLLC) to exchange said license for a Class A-7 BWL license.

In 2018, the General Assembly of Maryland and Governor Hogan enacted Chapter 537 of the Laws of Maryland of 2018. This change in the law allows Class B-D-7 BWL license holders to exchange their licenses for a Class A-7 BWL license, contingent upon receiving "...approval by resolution of the Baltimore City Council."¹ Class A-7 BWL license holders may sell Beer, Wine, and Liquor at retail for off-premises consumption from 10:00am to midnight, seven (7) days per week.² Additionally, unlike Class B-D-7 BWL license holders, Class A-7 BWL license holders are required to maintain and operate a digital surveillance system equipped with high-definition cameras that provide continuous, 24-hour video monitoring placed inside and outside the licensed premises.³

If adopted, City Council Bill 22-0094R would authorize the holder of the Class B-D-7 BWL license located at 1807-1811 Baker Street to exchange their license for a Class A-7 BWL license before the BLLC, as per State law. The BLLC has no position as to whether the Council approves this resolution.
