

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 17-0038 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would allow the City to condemn and close Proctor Street, a portion of Proctor Alley, and a 10- foot alley lying between East Biddle Street, Homewood Avenue, East Chase Street, and Greenmount Avenue, as shown on Plat 284-A-14A.

Art. II, Sections 2 and (34)(a) of the City Charter grant the Mayor and City Council the power to condemn and "construct, open, extend, widen, straighten or close streets, bridges, tunnels or approaches to them and other public ways of every kind within the bounds of the City." Section 116(b)(2) of Article VII of the City Charter requires the Department of Transportation to prepare all ordinances for the opening and closing of streets. As this bill conforms to the applicable sections of the Charter, the Law Department approves it for form and legal sufficiency.

Article II Sections 2, 34, and 35 of the Baltimore City Charter establishes a process for disposing of City thoroughfares. The final step in the process is enactment of an Ordinance of the Mayor and City Council.

Background

CC 17-0137 is the companion Legislation to CC 17-0137 and is designed to aid development in East Baltimore. The Boundaries are generally Biddle Street on the N orth, Chase Street on the South, Homewood Avenue on the East, and Greenmount Avenue on the West.

The subject properties are 3 disconnected parcels, containing portions of Proctor Street and 2 alleys. The total size of the parcels is approximately 1/9th of an acre.

CC 17-0137 condemns are close the above described properties. Transfer will be made by separate Ordinance.

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


