Major Issues Discussed

- 1. The Chairman informed all attendees about how the hearing would proceed.
- 2. President Scott gave opening remarks. Some highlights of his conversation were:
 - We want to make sure the transgender community is protected and taking care of
 - Talked about some of the violent incidents that has occurred in the transgender community
 - Made comments about the beautiful culture of the transgender community
 - We must support and protect all Baltimoreans!
- 3. Testimony was received from several city agency representations and other organizations. Some highlights of their conversations were:
 - A representative from the <u>Health Department</u> talked about some of the services the Department provides to the transgender community.
 - Several representatives from the Police Department testified:
 - o A PowerPoint Presentation was given a copy is on file
 - o Comments/Discussions About:
 - Understands the challenges the transgender community faces
 - Transgender Inequity
 - About polices in place to assist the transgender community
 - Types of arrests and/or enforcement
 - Per Michelle Wirzberger, she will forward the link for information available by the Department
 - Some of the questions and/or comments from the <u>committee/council members</u> that were addressed to the <u>Police Department</u>
 - o Comments and/or concern surrounding sex worker issues
 - A recent change of policy concerning condoms why the push and/or change?
 - A representative from the **Baltimore City Public School System** testified. Some highlights of his discussion were:
 - o About partnerships and advocacy pertaining to sex-based discrimination
 - o Policies in place used to assist the transgender community
 - o Compliances and stated that the BCPSS is committed to this community
 - o Talked about gender neutral facilities within the BCPSS
 - Some of the questions and/or comments from the <u>committee/council members</u> that were addressed to the **BCPSS**:
 - o Gender-Neutral facilities
 - How are you moving forward with these facilities? Response: We are moving forward to making all schools gender-neutral.

- Request made by Councilman Cohen: Please report back about the progress made with the gender-neutral facilities; a timeline to include how many buildings already have these type facilities.
- What are some of the things the BCPSS are doing to assist the transgender community; such as bullying?
- A representative from the **Behavioral Health System** testified. Some highlights of his discussion were:
 - o Talked about that the organization does
 - o Talked about some of the trauma experienced by the transgender community
 - o About the initiatives and support that are available to the community
 - o About behavioral health and wellness services
- A representative from <u>Homelessness Services</u> testified. Some highlights of her discussion were:
 - o Services available to the transgender community
 - o Recognizes that institutional discrimination does exist
 - o Is committed to giving accessibility where needed
- A representative from the <u>Office of the Mayor</u>, <u>LGBTQ Affairs Office</u> testified. Some highlights of his discussion were:
 - o Thanked the committee for holding the hearing
 - o Stands by their agency report
 - o Talked about the role/duties of his position
 - o Goal is to right the wrong and redirect the future
 - o The transgender community is bought together by open oppression
 - o Many of the challenges of the community are solve through "specificity"
 - o Many residents in the transgender community experience a life of scarcity and oppression
 - o This has been the deadliest year of all for the killing of transgender people!
 - o Currently we do not live in a world where transgender people can thrive!
 - o There are so many barriers preventing the community from thriving
 - o I implore you to take in their remarks today!
 - o There is a lack of available health care
 - o Many people don't understand the meaning and/or what "gender" means
 - The transgender community is calling on the Mayor and City Council to abolish Article 19 – The loitering law
 - We need to have a citywide conversation on humanity and requests the City Council's full support!
- Some of the questions and/or comments from the <u>committee/council members</u> that were addressed to the <u>representative from the Office of the Mayor:</u>
 - Housing issues seems to come up all the time, discrimination, funding, etc. What does this issue look like to you and what do you think is needed to make progress in the community? Response: We need to look to other municipalities that have been successful supporting the transgender community with housing and we need to have a conversation about available resources

- A representative from <u>Baltimore Safe Haven</u> testified. Some highlights of his/her discussion were:
 - We are in a state of emergency for black transgender people in Baltimore City!
 - Issues:
 - ✓ Equal opportunity
 - ✓ Discrimination, bullying
 - ✓ Suicide, trauma
 - ✓ Oppression
 - ✓ Diseases, infection, lack of health care
 - ✓ All coming from the place we call home!
- Several residents and/or other attendees testified. Some highlights from his/her conversations were:
 - o Comments/Concerns:
 - Where is our help?
 - Where is the plan?
 - We need you today!
 - Resources are needed
 - The community needs housing and funding
 - Getting adequate jobs is of concern (being inclusive)
 - Please speak to us not through us!
 - Supports Baltimore Safe Haven but still not enough organizations are available, we need more
 - Concern: Need more legal services available
 - Concern: Would like to see more Councilmembers attend meeting in the community
 - Concern: Affordable housing and harm reduction
 - o One speaker talked about her life experiences working with and/or through Baltimore Safe Haven
 - o One Speaker spoke on behalf of the Senior Trans Women
 - Is a trans women
 - Concern: Being put in a place that matches her gender
 - It is important to "follow through" when needed
 - Trans organizations need to be supported
 - We are not sex workers, that is not what we are!
 - Let's not play games about what the Police really do! Policies need to be worked on
 - One speaker gave a PowerPoint Presentation a copy is on file
- Some questions addressed to the speakers from Councilman Cohen were:
 - o The Trauma-Informed Task Force will be looking at comprehensive trauma across the city. Are there any recommendations you have to help support the transgender community?
 - o Ten (10) years out if the proper resources were allocated, what would it look like in Baltimore City?
- 4. The chairman gave closing remarks, "There is a lot more work to do in the transgender community." Hearing concluded. Vote taken.
