### **Major Issues Discussed**

- 1. Councilmember Burnett, primary sponsor of the Resolution gave opening remarks. Some were:
  - The goal is to improve the standard(s) of housing for people
  - Some issues are:
    - o Inconsistency of inspections
    - o Conditions should be safe and healthy
    - o Notification process, and
    - o Renewal of licenses
  - Today we would like to hear more about the licensing process and other pertinent processes
- 2. The chairman went over the agency reports with the agency representatives.
- 3. Committee/council members asked questions, made comments and etc. Some were:

### To the representative from the Department of Housing and Community Development

- Can you walk us through the Inspection Process; start to finish?
- How do you find your Inspectors and what qualifications do they need?
- Unlicensed Properties
  - o What happens when landlords don't apply to the law?
  - o Difficulty getting licenses! Have this process improved?
  - o Do you know how many properties are unlicensed? Answer: Approximately 50%
  - o Comments:
    - I think the law needs to be strengthen for non-compliance when a landlord does not have a license!
    - There must be much stronger laws!
    - Is the DCHD looking at ways to strengthen the laws?
    - Something drastic must be done to get a handle on this issue
- Complaints:
  - Walk us through what happens when a tenant lodges a complaint.
  - o How can a license be revoked?
  - O What is the process for someone who wants to lodge a complaint against an Inspector?
  - o How do you vet and/or identify Inspectors who may have an investment in a property or is invested with the property owner? Answer: You can't inspect your own property and we have internal enforcement
  - What type of communication do you have with the State of Maryland to address complaints?
- Concerns:
  - o Landlords being in co-hoots with Inspectors
  - o Do you examine all paperwork?
  - o How does this work?
  - o Hopefully we can get to the bottom of this!
  - o Having enforcement when needed
  - o Slumlords are of concern and very challenging
  - o Inspectors letting "things go," improprieties
  - o Burden of Proof/Compliance

- o Talked about bad living conditions
  - Mold
  - Infestation of pests
  - Receives empty promises for getting repairs
  - Receives retaliatory eviction
  - Unsafe conditions (is of concern)
  - Need more DHCD Inspections along with second opinions
  - Inspectors/landlords need to be held to a certain standard!
  - Need an on-going relationship with DHCD!
- o A lot of tenants give up due to lack of responses
- o Is doing the best she can with living arrangement
- o Comment: If I don't keep the lids on trash containers, I get fined. Landlords should be fined too for non-compliance

5. Councilman Burnett gave closing remarks, thanked everyone for attending and stated, "I have heard many of the same concerns stated here today from my constituency. Some loopholes need to be closed. Access is critical and we will continue to work with the DHCD. Hearing recessed to reconvene at a later date.
