I emphatically ask that ordinance 24-0599 "Zoning - Conditional Use - Crematorium" be immediately withdrawn, and replaced with writing a "2 Year Step" Ordinance. For the purpose of converting crematory industry to legal natural organic soil reduction composting process, known as "Natural or Green Burials" and stoppage of enclosed cremation process and extinguishing crematorium use by December 31st, 2026. This zoning bill in actuality promotes "stand alone" crematorium industry, as they take up less space, falsely leading entrepreneurs to believe that this gassy archaic gruesome business - has a future. Councilman Conway's ordinance introduction on September 30th was clearly, superficially, and specifically addressing more-well-to-do "Not in my back yard" NIMBY Govans Neighborhood advocate plight of a crematorium funeral business extension. The fact is no one wants to smell and breathe burning bodies and that ALL crematoriums ruin EVERY Baltimore Citizen's health, because no one can stop breathing - and live.
