Baltimore City Council President Zeke Cohen, Baltimore City Fire Chief James Wallace and members of the Baltimore City Council to join a public safety walk hosted by Councilmember Jermaine Jones in Remington

Baltimore, MD – On Saturday February 1st, 2025, Baltimore City Council President Zeke Cohen and Baltimore Fire Department Chief James Wallace, along with members of the Baltimore City Council, will join a Fire Safety Community Walk hosted by District 12 Councilmember Jermaine Jones.

Background: Baltimore has seen a rising number of devastating fire incidents in recent months, and fire safety concerns are at their highest during the winter months. The Baltimore City Fire Department has reported at least 35 fire fatalities in the past two years. According to the National Fire Protection Agency, smoke alarms in homes can reduce the risk of dying in a fire by 60%.

The community walk gives members of the Baltimore City Council and Baltimore Fire Department the opportunity to interact directly with City residents to inspect their fire equipment, provide free smoke detectors, and connect them with other vital City agencies and services.

What: A press conference followed by a community walk to promote fire safety and engage with District 12 constituents.
