### **Major Issues Discussed**

- 1. Councilwoman Middleton opened the meeting, introduced committee members and City representatives, and read the bill into the record.
- 2. Councilmember Ramos commented that the focus of the work session is to assess the City's current status on assisting the homeless. She also inquired about provisions for permanent housing.
- 3. Ms. Faith Leach updated the committee about recent expenditures for the homeless.
- 4. Mr. William Welles and Ms. Irene Agustin presented a PowerPoint presentation updating the committee on the City's Covid-19 Response; Outreach and Encampments; Shelter Hotels; and the Housing First Program. Hotel shelter is covered by COVID funding. The City is being reimbursed for services above and beyond what would normally be provided.
- 5. Mr. Mark Council testified and explained the purpose of Housing Our Neighbors. He commented that hotel shelters are doing a good job. All rooms should be utilized, however, as the rooms are prepaid by FEMA. Some people who call the shelter hotline are being told to seek shelter at Code Blue shelters, but it is very difficult to remain at a 6 foot distance.
- 6. Ms. Alease Sykes testified about the quality and conditions of food service at shelters. She also testified that cases should be efficiently managed. She indicated that certain residents have been discharged from shelters with no additional assistance or guidance.
- 7. The hearing was adjourned.
