 - Is having a hard time attracting outside applicants due to higher wages offered and/or paid in other jurisdictions
 - Is competing with the surrounding counties
 - The Department is also building more relationships/partnerships with the universities and colleges
 - The Department also have an apprenticeship program
 - Talked about the Department's Talent Management Program
 - Requested by Member Cohen: Please submit the following information:
 - How many employees left the Department (gone)
 - How many employees the Department has gained
 - o Department's Budget/External Funding
 - Our Budget Director need to revisit your budget; a Plan without the proper funding is useless!
 - I encourage increasing the salary/wages for Department's employees
 - During the summer camp season our kids need places to go and/or visit;
 more funding should be set-a-side for this
 - What external funding have you secured? And how can the Council help with securing funding?
 - Have you looked to external funding to support the talent (employees) within your organization?
