16	WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of all involved in eviction proceedings for the process to
17	be streamlined, legal, and efficient.
18	Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
19	Council invites representatives from the Baltimore City Sheriff's Office, the Department of
20	Housing and Community Development, concerned citizens, and other interested parties to inform
21	the Council about the current procedure followed by the Sheriff's Office during the eviction
22	process, any recurring problems that need to be addressed, any improvements that can be made to
23	facilitate communication of the Sheriff's Office's ability to appear at a residence on a designated
24	day and time, and any efforts to improve eviction procedures.
