Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Chairwoman McCray called the hearing to order and discussed the importance of addressing the problem of mold in housing.
- 2. Councilman Burnett noted that his office gets frequent calls from constituents dealing with mold in their homes and explained how mold can lead to significant health issues and costs.
- 3. Alice Kennedy discussed issues related to mold in housing, the lack of clear guidance from federal and state regulators, and Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) loan and grant programs to help property owners make repairs. She noted that DHCD inspectors do not test for mold and advise property owners to retain experts to test if they suspect mold.
- 4. Representatives for the other agencies confirmed the recommendations and comments in their written reports.
- 5. Agency representatives responded to Councilmember questions.
- 6. Members of the public testified about their personal experiences dealing with mold in their homes and the need for additional protections and help for renters.
- 7. The Committee voted to recommend the resolution favorably.
