19	(IV) FIRE SUPPRESSION RESPONSE TIMES;
20	(V) EMS response times; and
21	(VI) ANY OTHER INFORMATION DEEMED NECESSARY BY THE FIRE CHIEF;
22 23	(2) BASED UPON THE DATA SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SECTION, INCLUDE IN THE PLAN STRATEGIES TO:
24 25	(I) ADJUST THE GEOGRAPHIC BOUNDARIES AND COMPOSITION OF EACH FIRE BATTALION AND EMS DISTRICT; AND
26 27	(II) REALLOCATE THE RESOURCES AND PERSONNEL OF THE DEPARTMENT AMONG THE BATTALIONS AND DISTRICTS; AND

1 2 3	(3) PRESENT THE PLAN TO THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL WITHIN 1 YEAR FROM THE ISSUANCE OF THE DECENNIAL CENSUS POPULATION AND HOUSING DATA BY THE UNITED STATES CENSUS BUREAU.
4	§ 2A-3. APPROVAL PROCESS.
5	(A) APPROVAL OF THE PLAN.
6 7 8	Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, the Mayor and City Council may approve the Plan by $\frac{1}{1}$ denoted within 180 days from the presentation of the Plan.
9	(B) AMENDMENTS TO THE PLAN.
10 11 12	THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS MAY <u>AMEND THE PLAN BY ENUMERATING</u> <u>ANY AMENDMENTS IN THE ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PLAN.</u> PROPOSE AMENDMENTS TO THE PLAN.
13 14	(1) PRIOR TO PASSAGE OF THE RESOLUTION DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION; AND
15	(2) WITHIN 180 DAYS FROM THE PRESENTATION OF THE PLAN.
16	(C) APPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS.
17 18	AMENDMENTS PROPOSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION BECOME EFFECTIVE ON APPROVAL BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE CITY COUNCIL.
19	(D) (C) EFFECTIVE DATE.
20	(1) A PLAN APPROVED UNDER THIS SECTION IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
21 22 23	(2) IF THE PLAN IS NOT APPROVED WITHIN 180 DAYS AFTER PRESENTATION OF THE PLAN, THE PLAN, AS ORIGINALLY PRESENTED BY THE FIRE CHIEF TO THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL, WILL GO INTO EFFECT.
24 25	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
