Analysis

Current Law

Article V – Comptroller; Section 5(b); Baltimore City Charter; (1996 Edition)

Background

If enacted, Bill 21-0182 would authorize the sale of the property located at 900-912 Baltic Avenue (Block 7271, Lot 001) in the <u>Brooklyn area</u> of the city; <u>Council District #10</u>. *See attached picture*

<u>Per the Department of Real Estate</u>, a Request for Proposal was advertised; seeking Developers who are willing and able to develop the site. Three (3) proposals were received; <u>Allen and Son Moving</u> <u>& Storage</u> received the highest marks.

<u>Allen and Son Moving & Storage, Inc</u>. has been in the moving industry for over thirty (30) years as a certified veteran owned business.¹

Upon approval by the Mayor and City Council, the Department of Real Estate will continue negotiating the sale of the property and the Board of Estimates would have to approve the deal to finalize the disposition.

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 21-0182 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill authorizes the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public 4 or private sale, all its interest in certain property located at 900-912 Baltic Avenue (Block 5 7271, Lot 001) and no longer needed for public use. It provides for an immediate effective date.

Article V, Section 5 (b) of the Baltimore City Charter grants the Department of Real Estate in the Comptroller's Office the power to arrange for the disposition of any building or parcel of land no longer needed by the City for public use, if that sale is approved by the Board of Estimates. Assuming the agency reports reveal that the property is no longer needed for public use, this is the appropriate ordinance to authorize disposition of the subject property. Therefore, the Law Department approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.

The Department of Finance is herein reporting on City Council Bill 21-0182, Sale of Property – 900-912 Baltic Avenue, for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all interest in the property located at 900-912 Baltic Avenue (Block 7271, Lot 001).

Background

The property is located the Brooklyn neighborhood. The property is zoned for Industrial (I-2) and has a garage with an office, situated on 26,005 square feet of land. The Department of Real Estate in the Comptroller's Office issued a Request for Proposal in March 2020 and received three proposals, which were reviewed by a panel of City agency personnel and a community representative. Allen & Son Moving and Storage received the highest marks of all proposals reviewed.

Fiscal Impact Analysis

The Department of Finance anticipates minimal fiscal impact from this legislation. The sales price will be negotiated by the Department of Real Estate, based on an appraisal, and approved by the Board of Estimates.

Conclusion

This legislation is a sale of property ordinance providing for the sale of the property located at 900-912 Baltic Avenue (Block 7271, Lot 001) to Allen & Son Moving and Storage. Finance anticipates minimal fiscal impact from this legislation.

For the reasons stated above, the Department of Finance does not oppose City Council Bill 21-0182.

The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) has reviewed City Council Bill 21-0182 for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in certain property located at 900-912 Baltic Avenue (Block 7271, Lot 001) and no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

If enacted, City Council Bill 21-0182 would allow for either the public or private sale of 900-912 Baltic Avenue. The property is owned by the Mayor and City Council and currently subject to a vacant building notice. Approval of the sale and the subsequent abatement of the vacant building notice could support the productive reuse of the property.

City Council Bill 21-0182 has no fiscal impact on DHCD. We support the Administration's disposition of the property which may further revitalization objectives. The property is no longer serving a public use and rehabilitation of the property could create additional opportunities for industrial uses in the Brooklyn Community and Fairfield Area, as allowed in the I-2 zoning district.

We respectfully request a **favorable** report on Council Bill 21-0182.

Background

The site is located I the Brooklyn Community and is zoned I-2 (Industrial) it is improved by a four (4) garage with an office space which need total rehabilitation, situated on 26,005 square feet of land.

The City of Baltimore was seeking developers who were willing and able to develop the Site in accordance with revitalizations goals and objectives. Three proposals were received. A panel of City agency personnel and a community representative listened to oral presentations from each developer and subsequently ranked.

Allen & Son Moving and Storage received the highest marks of all proposals reviewed. If approved by the City Council, the Department of Real Estate will proceed with disposition to them.

The Parking Authority of Baltimore City (PABC) has reviewed the proposed legislation. PABC does not administer any on-street parking programs in the area of the parcel indicated in the legislation. The proposed sale of the property would not negatively impact any PABC programs or plans.
