Analysis

Current Law

Article V – Comptroller; Section 5(b); Baltimore City Charter; (1996 Edition)

Background

If enacted, Bill 22-0201 would authorize the sale of the property located at 4601 East Monument Street (Block 6469, Lot 001F) in the <u>Orangeville area</u> of the city; <u>Council District #2</u>. <u>See attached picture</u> – <u>before building was demolished</u>.

Per the Department of Real Estate, the property use to serve as a hotel and a homeless shelter.

<u>Per the Baltimore Development Corporation, (BDC)</u>, "the site is owned by the city and the building was demolished and surplused. A 'Request for Proposal' (RFP) will be issued. The property is on a '24-hour truck route' and believes they will hear from several businesses on the purchase of same."

Upon approval by the Mayor and City Council, the Board of Estimates would have to approve the deal to finalize the disposition.



Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 22-201 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in certain property that is located at 4601 East Monument Street (Block 6469, Lot 001F) and is no longer needed for public use; and provide for a special effective date.

Article V, Section 5 (b) of the Baltimore City Charter grants the Department of Real Estate in the Comptroller's Office the power to arrange for the disposition of any building or parcel of land no longer needed by the City for public use, if that sale is approved by the Board of Estimates. Assuming the agency reports reveal that the property is no longer needed for public use, this is the appropriate ordinance to authorize disposition of the subject property. Therefore, the Law Department approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.

Re: City Council Bill 22-0201 - Sale of Property - 4601 East Monument Street

The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) has reviewed City Council Bill 22-0201 for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in certain property that is located at 4601 East Monument Street (Block 6469, Lot 001F) and is no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

If enacted, City Council Bill 22-0201 would allow for either the public or private sale of 4601 East Monument Street. The property is owned by the Mayor and City Council and currently subject to a vacant building notice. Former uses of the property include a hotel and a homeless shelter. The property has active demolition permits. Approval of the sale and the subsequent abatement of the vacant building notice could support the productive reuse of the property.

City Council Bill 22-0201 has no fiscal impact on DHCD. We support the Administration's disposition of the property which may further revitalization objectives. The property is no longer serving a public use and rehabilitation of the property could create additional opportunities for industrial uses in the Orangeville Area, as allowed in the I-2 zoning district.

We respectfully request a **favorable** report on Council Bill 22-0201.
