Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Chairwoman Middleton opened the meeting, introduced committee members and City representatives and read the bill into the record.
- 2. Councilmember Ramos explained the purpose of the bill. She provided general information about establishment of the Charles Village Community Benefits District and their primary goals.
- 3. Councilmember Stokes commented about services provided by the Charles Village Community Benefits District. He emphasized the need to replicate the program model citywide. He acknowledged the great work that Ms. Williams is doing.
- 4. Adam Abadir testified on behalf of the Department of Housing and Community Development, City Solicitor and Department of Finance. Chairwoman Middleton stressed the need for timely agency reports.
- 5. Ms. Kristina Williams testified in support of the bill. She shared background information about the Benefits District which is focused on notifying, educating and advocating residents of the district and providing supplemental services including public safety, sanitation and outreach, as well as many other services. CVCBD employs 26 City residents and seeks to pay a living wage. Over half of the vendors contracts are with minority and women- owned businesses.
- 6. The committee voted to recommend the bill as favorable.
- 7. The hearing was adjourned.
