Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilwoman Middleton opened the meeting, introduced committee members and City representatives. She read the bill into the record.
- 2. Councilmember Torrence commented on the purpose of the bill.
- 3. Agency representatives testified on behalf of their respective agencies.
- 4. Nicholas Blendy informed the committee that the City's authority to approve bill's similar to Bill 22-0094R would sunset on June 30, 2022. Exchanges of the Class B-D-7 license for the Class A-7 license would not be allowed after June 30, 2022 unless the Maryland General Assembly grants a re-authorization.
- 5. The committee had general discussion about the bill. Taverns with Class B-D-7 licenses must be open in order to sell packaged alcohol. If the tavern is not open, packaged alcohol cannot be sold.
- 3. The committee voted to recommend the bill favorably.
- 4. The hearing was adjourned.
