### **Re: City Council Bill 22-0232 Bond Issue - School Loan - \$38,000,000**

The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) has reviewed City Council Bill 22-0232 for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore (pursuant to General Assembly House Resolution II and Senate Resolution II of 2022 approved by the members of the Maryland General Assembly representing Baltimore City) to create a debt, and to issue and sell, at any time or from time to time and in one or more series its certificates of indebtedness as evidence thereof, and proceeds not exceeding THIRTY-EIGHT Million Dollars (\$38,000,000.00) from the sale of such certificates of indebtedness to be used for the cost of issuance, including the expense of engraving, printing, advertising, attorneys' fees, and all other incidental expenses connected therewith (which may include the proportion of the compensation of employees and general administrative expenses of the Department of Finance reasonably allocated to the issuance of the bonds); and the remainder of such proceeds shall be used for the acquisition, by purchase, lease, co...

At its regular meeting of May 19, 2022, the Planning Commission concurred with the recommendation of departmental staff and recommended approval of City Council Bill 22-0232.

The bond funds will be utilized by the city for, or in connection with, demolishing buildings and constructing new school buildings, athletic and other auxiliary facilities, including community health and recreation facilities and for additions and improvements to, or the modernization or reconstruction of existing facilities. Bond funding furthers DHCD's mission to improve the quality of life for all Baltimore City residents by revitalizing and redeveloping communities and promoting access to quality affordable housing opportunities in safe, livable neighborhoods. The issuance of bonds for the purpose of improving the learning environment for Baltimore City schoolchildren is critical to the continued growth and stability of Baltimore neighborhoods.

DHCD **supports** the passage of Council Bill 22-0232 and respectfully requests a favorable report.
