 - o Tree Stump Removal
 - What processes are involved for removing a tree stump?
 - Who is the contractor for stump grinding?
 - When do you except the backlog for stump removals to get down to two (2) months? Requested by Chairman Costello: Provide a response by Tuesday, June 7, 2022
 - Requested by Chairman Costello: Provide a written narrative on how you plan to bring in additional contractors for stump grinding by June 7, 2022.
 To include; list of existing equipment, equipment that need to be replaced and funds needed for same.
 - Do you know how many tree stumps need to be removed?
 - How many stumps have been removed since November 2021?
 - Concern removing every stump with every tree removal
 - Payout liabilities from limbs falling from trees is of concern
 - Removing trees in an efficient matter is of concern
 - You understand our frustration on this topic; new solutions are needed!
 - Requested by Member Schleifer: Provide a list of how many stumps were removed for the following fiscal years: 2020, 2021 and 2022
 - Requested by Member Dorsey: Bid Protest Provide who protested the bids for tree stump removal (who and why)

 We have a serious procurement problem; the problem is procurement not Rec and Parks

Apprenticeship Programs

- Now is a good time for an apprenticeship program to help add to staff hiring
- You should connect with city schools

- More field trips are needed at all Rec Centers (more funding is needed)

- Youth Workers
