I. Sheriff's Office

 - o Why are there only six (6) deputy sheriffs working on warrants?
 - o How many are assigned to the Courthouse?
 - o How many of your employees graduated from the past academy? Answer: Five
 - o How many are in the next class? Answer: Three (3)
 - o How many arrest warrants are served? Answer: Approximately 18 per month
 - o What is your backlog? Answer: None at present
 - o The Chief Deputy could not attend the hearing tonight either? Answer: No



These services include, but are not limited to, service of court documents, execution of warrants and Sheriff's sales, collection of fines and fees, transportation of prisoners, and providing courthouse security. Deputy Sheriffs have the authority to enforce civil, criminal, and traffic laws, and perform these duties in conjunction with the Baltimore City Police Department. These duties include, but are not limited to, criminal patrol and crime suppression details, traffic enforcement, and crowd control for special events.
