## Analysis

## Current Law

I. Pursuant to House Resolution II and Senate Resolution II of 2022 approved by the member of the Maryland General Assembly representing Baltimore City. – Council Bill 22-0232

II. Section 7 of Article XI of the Constitution of Maryland along with City voters ratifies local legislation permitting the City to issue General Obligation Bonds.

## Background

In 2020, voters approved \$80 million in General Obligation Bonds (**GOB**) per year for Fiscal 2022 and 2023; totaling \$160 million.

- \$12 million for Affordable Housing Loan
- \$72 million for Public Infrastructure Loan
- \$38 million for Community and Economic Development Loan, and
- \$38 million for School Loan

General Obligation Bonds are borrowed funds that are used for capital projects. **GOB** must be used for affordable housing, schools, public infrastructure, and community and economic development in accordance with the loan authorization approved by voters. The debt service to repay the bonds is paid from the City's future General Fund revenue. Funded projects for Fiscal 2023 include:

- \$1.65 million for the construction of the new Parkview Recreation Center in the Penn North neighborhood
- \$2.9 million to renovate the Forest Park Enoch Pratt Free Library Branch; and
- \$19 million for Baltimore City Public School facilities, including \$2.25 million for the construction of the new Furley Elementary School and \$14 million systems replacements, renovations, and repairs across various buildings.

<u>Council Bills 22-0230 thru 22-0233 are all Bond Issues</u>. Once approved by the Mayor and City Council, all four bills will go to the qualified voters of Baltimore City on November 8, 2022, to ask for their approval to issue the bonds for fiscal years **2024** and **2025**.

Council Bill 22-0232, if approved will be used for <u>a School Loan</u>. Some of the uses from the loan includes: new school buildings, athletic and other auxiliary facilities including community health and recreation facilities, for additions and improvements and etc. Totaling \$38 million; (\$19 million each fiscal year); the same amount that was submitted and approved in 2020.

The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) has reviewed City Council Bill 22-0232 for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore (pursuant to General Assembly House Resolution II and Senate Resolution II of 2022 approved by the members of the Maryland General Assembly representing Baltimore City) to create a debt, and to issue and sell, at any time or from time to time and in one or more series its certificates of indebtedness as evidence thereof, and proceeds not exceeding THIRTY-EIGHT Million Dollars (\$38,000,000.00) from the sale of such certificates of indebtedness to be used for the cost of issuance, including the expense of engraving, printing, advertising, attorneys' fees, and all other incidental expenses connected therewith (which may include the proportion of the compensation of employees and general administrative expenses of the Department of Finance reasonably allocated to the issuance of the bonds); and the remainder of such proceeds shall be used for the acquisition, by purchase, lease, co...

At its regular meeting of May 19, 2022, the Planning Commission concurred with the recommendation of departmental staff and recommended approval of City Council Bill 22-0232.

The bond funds will be utilized by the city for, or in connection with, demolishing buildings and constructing new school buildings, athletic and other auxiliary facilities, including community health and recreation facilities and for additions and improvements to, or the modernization or reconstruction of existing facilities. Bond funding furthers DHCD's mission to improve the quality of life for all Baltimore City residents by revitalizing and redeveloping communities and promoting access to quality affordable housing opportunities in safe, livable neighborhoods. The issuance of bonds for the purpose of improving the learning environment for Baltimore City schoolchildren is critical to the continued growth and stability of Baltimore neighborhoods.

DHCD **supports** the passage of Council Bill 22-0232 and respectfully requests a favorable report.

## City Council Bill 22-0232 Bond Issue – School Loan - \$38,000,000

June 17, 2022

Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools) has reviewed City Council Bill 22-0232, which seeks to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore (pursuant to General Assembly House Resolution II and Senate Resolution II of 2022 approved by the members of the Maryland General Assembly representing Baltimore City) to create a debt, and to issue and sell, its certificates of indebtedness as evidence thereof, and proceeds not exceeding THIRTY-EIGHT Million Dollars (\$38,000,000.00) from the sale of such bonds to be used for school purposes.

City Schools supports City Council Bill 22-0232. The proceeds of these bonds shall be used for the acquisition by purchase, lease, condemnation or any other legal means, of land or property for school purposes including school buildings, athletic and other auxiliary facilities, and for additions and improvements to, and demolishing, constructing, and erecting on said land or property, and for equipment for any and all new or existing facilities authorized.

City Schools finds that the issuance of bonds for these purposes is necessary and desirable for improving public school facilities and educational services in the City. All plans and specifications for the construction or reconstruction of school buildings, or for additions or improvement to school buildings, to be financed out of the proceeds derived from the sale of the bonds, shall be subject to the approval of the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners prior to the final acceptance of such plans and specifications, and the endorsement of approval by the Board of such plans and specifications shall be made thereon.

City Schools recommends favorable consideration of this bill. We will be pleased to testify regarding our support upon request. Thank you for inviting us to participate in this important process.

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore (pursuant to General 4 Assembly House Resolution II and Senate Resolution II of 2022 approved by the members of the Maryland General Assembly representing Baltimore City) to create a debt, and to issue 5 and sell, at any time or from time to time and in one or more series its certificates of 6 indebtedness as evidence thereof, and proceeds not exceeding THIRTY-EIGHT Million 7 Dollars (\$38,000,000.00) from the sale of such certificates of indebtedness to be used for the 8 9 cost of issuance, including the expense of engraving, printing, advertising, attorneys' fees, and all other incidental expenses connected therewith (which may include the proportion of 10 11 the compensation of employees and general administrative expenses of the Department of 12 Finance reasonably allocated to the issuance of the bonds); and the remainder of such proceeds shall be used for the acquisition, by purchase, lease, condemnation or any other 13 legal means, of land or property, or any rights therein, in the City of Baltimore, and 14 demolishing, constructing and erecting on said land or property, or on any land or property 15 now or hereafter owned by the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners and/or the 16 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, new school buildings, athletic and other auxiliary 17 facilities including community health and recreation facilities, and for additions and 18 improvements to, or the modernization or reconstruction of, including the inspection, 19 removal, encapsulation, management, containment and abatement of asbestos from existing 20facilities, and for equipment for any and all new or existing facilities authorized to be 21 constructed, erected, added, improved, modernized or reconstructed by the provisions hereof; 22 23 the payment of any and all costs and expenses incurred for or in connection with doing any or all of the things herein mentioned, including, but not limited to, the costs and expenses of 24 securing administrative, appraisal, economic analysis, engineering, planning, designing, 25 architectural, surveying, and other professional services, including, without limitation, 26 services relating to planning for future projects of the same general character which may be 27 constructed out of future loans; and for doing any and all things necessary, proper or 28 expedient in connection with or pertaining to any or all of the matters or things hereinbefore 29 30 mentioned; authorizing the issuance of refunding bonds; conferring certain powers upon the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners; imposing certain conditions in connection 31 with the expenditure of the proceeds derived from the sale of said certificates of 32

indebtedness; conferring and imposing upon the Board of Finance of Baltimore City certain
powers and duties; authorizing the submission of this Ordinance to the legal voters of the
City of Baltimore, for their approval or disapproval, at the Election to be held on Tuesday,
the 8th day of November, 2022, and providing for the expenditure of the proceeds of sale of
said certificates of indebtedness in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the
Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and by the municipal agency designated in the annual
Ordinance of Estimates of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

8 WHEREAS, By General Assembly House Resolution II and Senate Resolution II of 2022, 9 approved by the members of the Maryland General Assembly representing Baltimore City, the 10 Mayor and City Council is authorized to create a debt and to issue and sell its certificates of 11 indebtedness (hereinafter called "bonds") as evidence thereof, and proceeds not exceeding 12 THIRTY-EIGHT Million Dollars (\$38,000,000.00) from the sale of such bonds to be used for 13 school purposes as authorized by said Resolution; and

14 WHEREAS, Funds are now needed for said purposes; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the 15 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Finance of said 16 municipality, be and it is hereby authorized and empowered to create a debt and to issue and sell 17 bonds of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore from time to time, as may be needed or 18 required for the purposes hereinafter named and said bonds shall be sold by the Board of Finance 19 from time to time and at such times as shall be requisite, and proceeds not exceeding THIRTY-20 21 EIGHT Million Dollars (\$38,000,000.00), from the sale of such bonds shall be used for the purposes hereinafter named, provided that this Ordinance shall not become effective unless it 22 shall be approved by a majority of the votes of the legal voters of Baltimore City cast at the time 23 and place hereinafter designated by this Ordinance. 24

### 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:

(a) The denomination or denominations of the bonds to be issued at any particular time
 and the place or places for the payment of principal and interest thereof are to be determined by
 the Board of Finance.

(b) The bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this Ordinance
may be issued to mature on such dates and in such amounts as the Board of Finance may
determine; provided that the entire principal amount represented thereby shall be discharged not
more than 40 years from the date of issuance of the bonds.

(c) The bonds, when issued, shall bear interest at such rate or rates as may be determined
 by the Board of Finance, which rate or rates may be fixed or variable or as determined by a
 method approved by the Board of Finance, and such interest shall be payable at such time or
 times as may be determined by the Board of Finance.

1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That a majority of the Board of Finance of the 2 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore be, and they are hereby, authorized to pass a resolution or 3 resolutions, from time to time, to determine and set forth any or all of the following:

(a) The amount of debt to be incurred by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore at any
particular time, and from time to time, under and pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance;
the date or dates when any bonds representing said debt, or any part thereof, are to mature, and
the amount or amounts of said debt, or any part thereof, which shall mature upon the aforesaid
date or dates; and the date or dates in each year, during the entire period of time when any of said
bonds are outstanding, when interest on any of said bonds shall be payable;

10 (b) The form or forms of the bonds representing the debt, or any part thereof, authorized 11 to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance at any particular time; and

(c) If the bonds are to be sold at public sale, the time, place, manner and medium of 12 advertisement of the readiness of the Board of Finance, acting for and on behalf of the Mayor and 13 14 City Council of Baltimore, to receive bids for the purchase of the bonds authorized to be issued hereunder or any part thereof; the form, terms and conditions of such bids; the time, place and 15 manner of awarding bonds so bid for, including the right whenever any of the bonds authorized 16 by this Ordinance are offered for sale and sold at the same time as other bonds of the City, to 17 establish the conditions for bids and awards and to award all of the bonds on an all or none basis. 18 19 and the time, place, terms and manner of settlement for the bonds so bid for; provided, however, 20 that notwithstanding anything in this section, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, or the Board of Finance, as the case may be, shall have the right to reject any or all bids therefor for any 21 22 reason.

### 23 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:

(a) All premiums resulting from the sale of any of the bonds issued and sold pursuant tothe provisions of this Ordinance shall be applied as directed by the Board of Finance.

(b) The debt authorized by the provisions of this Ordinance, and the bonds issued and
sold pursuant thereto and their transfer, and the principal and interest payable thereon (including
any profit made in the sale thereof), shall be and remain exempt from any and all State, county
and municipal taxation in the State of Maryland.

(c) All bonds issued and sold pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance may be sold at
 public sale by the solicitation of competitive bids or at private (negotiated) sale without
 advertisement or solicitation of competitive bids, for a price or prices which may be at, above or
 below par value of the bonds, as determined by resolution of the Board of Finance of the Mayor
 and City Council of Baltimore.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That until all of the interest on and principal of any bonds issued pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance have been paid in full, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall levy and impose an annual tax on each \$100 of assessable property in the City of Baltimore at a rate sufficient to produce revenue to pay all interest on and principal of all bonds theretofore issued and outstanding or authorized to be issued and outstanding, payable in the next succeeding year.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance shall be submitted to the
 legal voters of the City of Baltimore, for their approval or disapproval, at the General Election to
 be held in Baltimore City, on Tuesday, the 8th day of November, 2022.

10 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That prior to the date of the election 11 hereinbefore mentioned, notice shall be given to the public of the amount of money which the 12 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore is authorized to borrow, and the general purposes for 13 which such borrowed funds may be expended, under the terms and provisions of this Ordinance, 14 and the time when the election hereinbefore mentioned is to be held; and such public notice shall 15 be given in such manner and by such means or through such media and at such time or times as 16 may be determined, from time to time, by a majority of the Board of Finance.

SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the actual cash proceeds derived from the
 sale of the bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be used
 exclusively for the following purposes, to wit:

(a) So much thereof as may be necessary for the cost of issuance, including the expense
 of engraving, printing, advertising, attorneys' fees, and all other incidental expenses connected
 therewith (which may include the proportion of the compensation of employees and general
 administrative expenses of the Department of Finance reasonably allocated to the issuance of the
 bonds);

25 (b) The remainder of such proceeds shall be used for the acquisition, by purchase, lease, condemnation or any other legal means, of land or property, or any rights therein, in the City of 26 27 Baltimore, and demolishing, constructing and erecting on said land or property, or on any land or 28 property now or hereafter owned by the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners and/or 29 the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, new school buildings, athletic and other auxiliary facilities including community health and recreation facilities, and for additions and 30 improvements to, or the modernization or reconstruction of, including the inspection, removal, 31 encapsulation, management, containment and abatement of asbestos from existing school 32 33 buildings or facilities, and for equipment for any and all new or existing facilities authorized to be constructed, erected, added to, improved, modernized or reconstructed by the provisions 34 35 hereof; the payment of any and all costs and expenses incurred for or in connection with doing any or all of the things herein mentioned, including, but not limited to, the costs and expenses of 36 securing administrative, appraisal, economic analysis, engineering, planning, designing, 37 architectural, surveying, and other professional services, including, without limitation, services 38 relating to planning for future projects of the same general character which may be constructed 39 40 out of future loans; and for or in connection with or pertaining to any or all of the matters or things hereinbefore mentioned. 41

### 1 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:

2 (a) The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Finance thereof, is hereby authorized and empowered to issue its bonds for the purpose of 3 4 refunding any bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance by payment at maturity or the purchase or redemption of bonds in advance of maturity. The validity of any 5 refunding bonds shall in no way be dependent upon or related to the validity or invalidity of the 6 7 bonds being refunded. Such refunding bonds may be issued by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Finance thereof, for the purpose of providing it 8 9 with funds to pay any of its outstanding bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance at maturity, to purchase in the open market any of its outstanding bonds 10 authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance prior to their maturity, to redeem 11 prior to their maturity any outstanding bonds which are, by their terms, redeemable, to pay 12 13 interest on any outstanding bonds prior to their payment at maturity or purchase or redemption in advance of maturity, or to pay any redemption or purchase premium in connection with the 14 refunding of any of its outstanding bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this 15 16 Ordinance.

(b) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of thisOrdinance may be issued for the public purpose of:

(1) Realizing savings to Baltimore City in the aggregate cost of debt service on either
 a direct comparison or present value basis; or

(2) Debt restructuring that:

(i) In the aggregate effects such a reduction in the cost of debt service; or

(ii) Is determined by the Board of Finance of the Mayor and City Council of
 Baltimore to be in the best interests of Baltimore City, to be consistent with Baltimore City's
 long-term financial plan, and to realize a financial objective of Baltimore City including,
 improving the relationship of debt service to a source of payment such as taxes, assessments, or
 other charges.

(c) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
 Ordinance may be issued in whatever principal amount shall be required to achieve the purpose
 for the issuance of the refunding bonds, which amount may be in excess of the principal amount
 of the bonds refunded or the maximum principal amount of bonds authorized to be issued under
 Section 1 of this Ordinance.

- (d) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
   Ordinance may be issued to mature on such dates and in such amounts as the Board of Finance
   may determine; provided that the entire principal amount represented by the refunding bonds
   shall be discharged not more than 40 years from the date of issuance of the bonds being refunded.
- (e) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
  Ordinance may be sold at public sale by the solicitation of competitive bids or at private
  (negotiated) sale without advertisement or solicitation of competitive bids, for a price or prices
  which may be at, above or below the par value of the refunding bonds, as determined by
  resolution of the Board of Finance of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

1 (f) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this 2 Ordinance shall bear interest at such rate or rates as may be determined by the Board of Finance 3 of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, which rate or rates may be fixed or variable or as 4 determined by a method approved by the Board of Finance, and such interest shall be payable at 5 such time or times as may be determined by the Board of Finance.

- 6 (g) The proceeds of the sale of any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold 7 under the provisions of this Ordinance, after the payment of issuance costs relating thereto, shall 8 be set aside by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore as a separate trust fund to be used solely 9 for the purposes stated in this Section 9.
- (h) Except as otherwise provided in this Section 9, the powers granted in, the limitations
   and obligations imposed by, and the procedures specified in this Ordinance with respect to the
   issuance of bonds shall be applicable to the issuance of refunding bonds.
- (i) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
   Ordinance shall not be subject to any debt policy limitation that may from time to time be
   established by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.
- 16 **SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That in the expenditure of the proceeds of sale 17 of said bonds, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall observe the following conditions:
- (a) Subject to the provisions of the Charter of Baltimore City relating to the Planning
   Commission, the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners, shall have the authority to
   select sites for the construction of any new school buildings hereby authorized;
- (b) All plans and specifications for the construction or reconstruction of school buildings,
  or for additions or improvement to school buildings, to be financed out of the proceeds derived
  from the sale of the bonds herein authorized to be issued, shall be subject to the approval of the
  Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners prior to the final acceptance of such plans and
  specifications, and the endorsement of approval by the Board of such plans and specifications
  shall be made thereon, and shall also be recorded by the Board in its official minutes;
- (c) All changes in approved plans and specifications which may be found necessary and
   expedient during the course of construction shall also be subject to the approval of the Baltimore
   City Board of School Commissioners, and shall also be recorded by the Board in its official
   minutes; and
- (d) No part of the proceeds derived from the sale of the bonds hereby authorized to be
   issued shall be expended without the approval of the Baltimore City Board of School
   Commissioners.
