## **INTRODUCTION**

The Baltimore Development Corporation (BDC) is reporting on City Council Bill No. 22-0198 introduced by councilmembers Bullock and Stokes.

## **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this Bill is to rename the Baltimore City Health Department Building, located at 1001 East 5 Fayette Street, the Dr. Maxie T. Collier Health Department Building, after the first African-American Health Commissioner of the Baltimore City Health Department.

## **BRIEF HISTORY**

Dr. Maxie T. Collier was the first African-American Commissioner of the Baltimore City Health Department serving from 1987 to 1990. Dr. Collier was a staunch advocate of mental health services for African-American residents of Baltimore City and was an early champion of the needle-exchange program to prevent the spread of HIV. Dr. Collier deserves this honor and Baltimore City's deep love and respect.
