- 3. Details on the Cleaner, Greener, Beautiful-Baltimore Community Engagement Initiative, including the application process, eligibility, and targeted assistance to community organizations.
- 4. DPW's plan for restoring weekly recycling collection service.
- 5. A breakdown of causes for Bureau of Solid Waste employee unavailability for work.
- 6. Current rates for residential and commercial waste diversion.
- 7. Information on how DPW is collaborating with other agencies around composting and using composted material.
- 8. DPW's equity plan and a map showing locations of its waste reduction activities throughout the city.
- 9. The amount of waste the city is currently sending to the incinerator and how it compares to previous years.
- 10. The cost of one complete city-wide recycling pickup.
