RE: City Council Resolution #22-0117R Informational Hearing: Baltimore Public Sanitation- Homeless Encampments

Dear Council President Mosby and Members of the City Council:

The Baltimore Police Department (BPD) has reviewed Council Resolution **#22-0117R**, for the purpose of inviting representatives from the BPD and relevant city agencies to brief the City Council on potential strategies for mitigating waste left by homeless encampments, including a discussion regarding the procurement of a contracted service to clear hazardous waste from such encampments.

BPD is committed to utilizing the least intrusive, most effective methods of police intervention when responding to calls for service and crisis events involving our homeless population. Members have been trained to respect and preserve their dignity, civil rights, and to contribute to their overall health, safety, and welfare. The goal of BPD is only to engage in enforcement activities in these circumstances when it is absolutely necessary, connecting individuals to other agencies and resources when possible instead.

The Baltimore Police Department has no objection to this resolution. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this legislation. We look forward to a robust discussion on this topic.
