### **Major Issues Discussed**

- 1. Chairwoman McCray called the hearing to order and discussed the need to assist people who have experienced sewage backups into their homes.
- 2. Councilman Burnett discussed the findings in the Department of Public Works' (DPW) feasibility study and why the city should expand and improve the reimbursement and direct assistance programs.
- 3. Mohamed Rahman presented on the causes of building backups, the number of building backups that have occurred in the city in recent years, and the findings and recommendations from DPW's feasibility study (presentation in file). Representatives for other agencies summarized the written reports.
- 4. Agency representatives responded to council member questions.
- 5. Members of the public testified about their personal experiences dealing with sewage backups, recommended improvements for the reimbursement and direct assistance programs, and argued that there is no legal basis for restricting the assistance programs to wet weather backups.
- 6. Chairwoman McCray explained that the committee will reconvene in the future and recessed the hearing.
