The Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation is in support of approval of the landmark designation of City Council Bill 22-0277 for the purpose of designating the Reed Calloway House, 1316 North Carey Street, as an historical landmark: exterior.

The Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (CHAP) read the staff report and the designation report and concluded that the building landmark criteria for designation

1. That are associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of Baltimore history; and
3. That embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction

CHAP has reviewed CC Bill 21-0277 at the October 11, 2022 hearing and unanimously supports landmark designation. Attached please find the staff report and the landmark designation report.
