Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilmember Middleton opened the meeting, introduced committee members and read the bill into the record.
- 2. Councilmember Bullock commented about the significant historical and architectural purpose of the bill and the need to support the efforts to preserve the properties.
- 3. Stacey Montgomery commented about the purpose of the bill and presented CHAP's recommendations and findings which are outlined in the agency's report.
- 4. Agency representatives provided reports for their respective agencies.
- 5. The committee opened the hearing for public testimony.
- 6. Johns Hopkins testified in support of the bill. He shared a story indicating that after being appointed director of Baltimore Heritage 18 years ago Councilmember Thomas Ward asked him directly to help to protect the property. He knows former Councilmember Ward would be happy to see his dream come to fruition.
- 7. Sonia Eaddy testified in support of preserving the many properties in her community. She indicated that the property has great historical and architectural value for the City and community, especially for the Black community. She believes property owed and built by Blacks should be treated with the same significance and protections as other properties throughout the City.
- 8. Nicole King testified in support of the project. She is a University of Maryland professor of American studies who worked with students on a project to document and preserve the history of Poppleton Community. She also indicated that history of Sarah Ann Street should be repaired and preserved.
- 9. Scott Kashnow testified in support of the bill.
- 10. The committee approved a motion to recommend the bill favorably.
- 11. The hearing was adjourned.
