Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Chairman Conway gave opening remarks. He talked about the history of the control of the Police Department and stated:
 - Baltimore City controlling our Police Department is the will of the voters
 - We do not want to further delay the transfer of authority; we know what our voters feel about the transfer of control!
 - o I don't understand why we still need so much more time!
- 2. The representative from the Office of Equity and Civil Rights talked about the role and/or duties of the Local Control Advisory Board. She talked about upcoming legislation in Annapolis, such as: Senate Bill 758, House Bill 853 and House Bill 975. She also stated that Annapolis is trying to come up with a "blended bill," as well. Legislative power must transfer from State to City in year 2023 not 2024! And we need time to prepare to take on the transfer and duties of the Department, she said.
- 3. Chairman Conway stated he was glad to see the bills. He asked where does the Advisory Board stand on the legislation in Annapolis? Which bills does the Board support and why?
- 4. Ray Kelly, a member of the Advisory Board talked about some of the language in HB 853 and SB 786; quoting some of the wording in same. We are focusing on the will of the people/voters and want control removed from the State and passed on to the City.
- 5. Chairman Conway stated more time is needed to do analysis for matters such as: fiscal, legal and other challenges. Currently the city can't write laws regarding Baltimore City Police Department; this need to be changed; only the State can do same. This matter need to be addressed before the session in Annapolis ends; action needs to be taken now! He asked, "Is it true the City must change certain parts of the City Charter when the transfer of power occurs? What are some of the challenges that is preventing you from coming up with a report? He asked the representative from the Law Department to talk more about where the city is with "legislative authority."

- 6. Several committee/councilmembers asked questions and gave remarks and/or stated concerns. Some highlights from same were:
 - o Comments:
 - Don't understand why we still need so much more time
 - Still don't understand why we can't move forward with the June 1st timeline! Sometimes you just have to move!
 - We are urging the Administration to support the June 1st date
 - The hoops we as a Council have to jump in order to get things done within the Police Department is concerning
 - Comments regarding Article II Section 27 of the City Charter
 - There are several inefficiencies within the Police Department because we don't have authority to make change
 - It seems like its been so much discussion, now is the time to act! To set us up for success!
 - o Questions and Concerns:
 - Does the Council have to take additional actions to critique our laws?
 - Current laws and possible changes ask for clarification
 - Have the topic of local control come up during the consent decree process?
 - We need to move as expeditiously as possible to transfer control; has there been a change in the Administration's posture in the transfer of control?
 - o Community Engagement
 - Comments regarding the importance of community input
 - Is any consideration given for community input?
- 7. Fourteen (14) people testified; 12 in person and 2 virtually. Some highlighted comments were:
 - o Supports restoring local control of the Police Department
 - o Need Police oversight and reform
 - o Comments regarding the Johns Hopkins Police Force
 - Supports related bills in Annapolis
 - o Concern: "table of justice"
 - o We don't need any more feedback; the people have spoken!
 - o We (the citizens of Baltimore City) don't deserve this delay!
- 8. Chairman Conway stated, "Who have the authority right now if not the City nor State?" Hearing called to recessed.
