WITHIN 60 DAYS OF PUBLISHING THE FINAL REPORT THE TASK FORCE SHALL CONDUCT AT LEAST 3 PUBLIC LISTENING SESSIONS AND SOLICIT FEEDBACK FROM INDIVIDUALS ON THE 3 POSSIBLE ALTERNATIVES FOR THE COMPOSITION, STRUCTURE, AND OPERATION OF A FISCAL POLICYMAKING BODY.
