# **Analysis**

### **Current Law**

Baltimore City Code; Article 6 – Historical and Architectural Preservation; Subtitle 4 – Designation of Landmarks

In general, an ordinance of the Mayor and City Council is required to:

- (1) add a structure and its appurtenant property to the Landmark List: Exteriors or the Landmark List: Public Interiors; or
- (2) for a structure already on the Landmark List: Exteriors, to modify the boundaries of the appurtenant land or other property that is included in the Landmark designation.

Recommendations from the Commission on Historical and Architectural Preservation and the Planning Commission must be submitted to the Council before the bill is placed on the second reading calendar.

# **Background**

Bill 22-0277 proposes to designate the Reed Calloway House, 1316 North Carey Street, as an historical landmark: exterior. The house is located in the Sandtown-Winchester community. This property is associated with the family of Cab Calloway, a nationally famed musician.
