Re: City Council Bill 23-0369 – High Performance Inclusionary Housing Tax Credit

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 23-0369 for form and legal sufficiency. It would create a credit against the City's portion of the real property tax for certain properties providing inclusionary housing. The General Assembly has given the City the power to enact local real property tax credits for green buildings, deemed high performance, with almost any additional criteria that the City desires. Md. Code, Tax-Prop., § 9-242. This bill is within the scope of that state enabling law.

The Law Department defers to the Finance Department as to how this credit would be implemented—including whether other parts of Article 28 (Taxes) of the City Code need to be amended to allow this credit to be received in addition to other tax credits to effectuate the intent in Section (D)(2) of the bill.

The Law Department approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
