 - o She talked about:
 - some of the things BCPS(s) are doing to address the math issue moving forward
 - the Leadership changes in the BCPS
 - The SY23-24 Math Improvement Plan

 - Chronic absenteeism should be a concern for everyone! And, is an exponential threat for learning!
 - Are you tracking chronic absenteeism?
 - o Students/Kids
 - Kids need meaningful things to do in the Summer!
 - Can you talk about your thoughts regarding four (4) versus five (5) school days?

- o Concerns:
 - Spikes in violence during the Summer months; hopefully this issue will be resolved!
- o Tutoring
 - What does "growth" look like with tutoring?
 - Requested by member Torrence: Provide the results from actual tutoring. Provide the analysis by grade level.
 - Learning Gap: What is the process for holding a student(s) back if needed?
- Board of School Commissioners
 - What role are the Board of School Commissioners playing in chronic absenteeism?
 - The public want to know what their roles are!
 - The representative for the Board of School Commissioners talked about some of the duties of the Board members
- o Classroom Size
 - What are you doing to reduce the size of classrooms?
- o Do you know how many seats are being offered for Summer school learning?
- Math in General
 - Math can be complicated!
 - There are many different types of learners
 - We must keep the courses excited for inclusiveness and for learning!
