ELEMENTARY

Camp Curiosity (incoming pre-K & K)*

Middle Grades Academic Recovery Program (grades 6 to 8) *

Academic recovery for English language arts and math with daily Social Emotional Learning (SEL) lessons and enrichment provided by Root Branch Media.

Middle Grades Access 2 Algebra (grades 6 to 8) *

Prepares students for STEM careers beyond high school.

Middle School Phys Ed Camp (grades 6 to 8) *

Physical activity enrichment with a focus on basketball and volleyball.

AileyCamp Baltimore (grades 6 - 8) *

A creative, active, supportive environment allowing participants to achieve

new heights in dance. Through rigorous dance instruction and personal development, campers learn to strengthen their sense of self.

ELEMENTARY/MIDDLE

Cadence Learning -NSSI (grades K to 8) *

Virtual math and ELA instruction with the program's best teachers.

Elev8 Freedom Schools (grades 2 to 8) *

Freedom Schools is a literacy-intensive summer experience, rooted in the civil rights movement. Freedom Schools uses an intra-generational servant leadership model to expose students to culturally affirming common core aligned literature.

CTY Baltimore Emerging Scholars Summer Program (grades 1 to 6) *

For students identified as gifted, advanced, talent development, or those who show signs of giftedness.

Summer Arts for Learning Academy (SALA) (Current Pre K-6 students only) **

An action-packed program that introduces students to a wide variety of art forms and gives students the opportunity to imagine, create, and express who they are through the arts.

Fine Arts Camp (grades K to 8) *

Students can engage in and explore music, visual arts, dance, and theater.

HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS

High School Credit Recovery Program (grades 9 to 12)+ High School Credit Recovery will be offered (no original credit will be offered). Students can earn a stipend through Youthworks if successfully registered.

High School English Learners Program (grades 9 to 12) + Youthworks if successfully registered. Designed to support English Learner students with interrupted education who are overaged and under-credited. Maximum of 2 courses.

APEX Credit Recovery Night School (grades 9 to 12) + Students can recover up to 3 credits in the late afternoon/evening. This program prioritizes potential summer graduates.

AP Summer Academy (grades 9 to 12) +

This program will support City Schools students who will be taking an AP or Pre-AP course next year. College visits and college application/scholarship support will be available as well. Students can earn a stipend through

Fine Arts Camp (grades 9 to 12) *

Scholars will be exposed to a variety of fine arts opportunities in visual and performing arts, gaining exposure to assorted disciplines to strength their visual arts AP portfolio, hone leadership and music skills. Students can earn a stipend through Youthworks if successfully registered.

The Spanish Theatre Camp*

(Students from 1st to 12th grade who are "English Learners", Spanish speakers and/or native Spanish speakers)

The Theater Camp is designed for Spanish- and Spanish-speaking English Learners who have already mastered Spanish speaking and listening skills. During the 5 weeks of camp, participants will participate in activities focused on acting, pantomime, music, improvisation, dance, script development, and many other elements associated with group and individual performance. As a final product, participants are expected to create an original script, memorize lines, participate in theatrical movement exercises, all in preparation for a short performance in Spanish that will be presented to their friends, family and community members.
