Street Encroachment – 3424 Toone Street

- FOR the purpose of permitting, subject to certain conditions, the construction and maintenance of a portion of a building projecting into the public right-of-way on the west side of Baylis Street, on the property known as 3424 Toone Street; and providing for a special effective date.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That:

- (a) Permission is granted for the construction and maintenance of a portion of a building located on the east side of the property known as 3424 Toone Street, the portion of the building extending into the public right-of-way of Baylis Street, subject to the conditions specified in this Ordinance. The area of encroachment is more clearly shown on a plat on file in the Department of Transportation, dated August 2022, prepared by Carballo Architecture.
 - (b) The structure may not project into the public right-of-way more than 3 feet.
- (c) Except as specifically provided in this Ordinance, all ordinances, rules, and regulations of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, including but not limited to the requirement to obtain a right-of-entry permit, must be complied with in the construction and maintenance of this structure.
