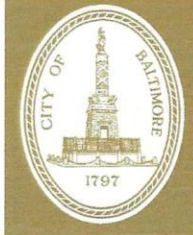

BILL SYNOPSIS

Mayor and City Council Resolution - Transit-Oriented Development - Penn Station

Sponsor: Council President (Administration)

Introduced: May 15, 2023

Purpose:

For the purpose of supporting a State Transit-Oriented Development designation for Penn Station, the area surrounding and including Baltimore Penn Station; and providing for a special effective date.

Analysis

Current Law

Title 7, Subtitle 1 of the State Transportation Article defines “Transit-oriented development” as a mix of private or public parking facilities, commercial and residential structures, and uses, improvements, and facilities customarily appurtenant to such facilities and uses, that:

- (1) Is part of a deliberate development plan or strategy involving:
 - (i) Property that is adjacent to the passenger boarding and alighting location of a planned or existing transit station; or
 - (ii) Property, any part of which is located within one-half mile of the passenger boarding and alighting location of a planned or existing transit station;
- (2) Is planned to maximize the use of transit, walking, and bicycling by residents and employees; and
- (3) Is designated as a transit-oriented development by:
 - (i) The Secretary, after considering a recommendation of the Smart Growth Subcabinet established under § 9-1406 of the State Government Article; and
 - (ii) The local government or multicounty agency with land use and planning responsibility for the relevant area.

The Maryland Governor’s Executive Order 01.01.2009.12 provides that it is a policy of the State of Maryland to locate State office or laboratory space within a half-mile radius of transit stations at a transit-oriented development whenever appropriate and feasible.

Bill Summary

The bill states that the City of Baltimore supports a State Transit-Oriented Development designation for Penn Station and the area surrounding Baltimore Penn Station, in accordance with the Maryland Governor’s Executive Order 01.01.2009.12 and the State Transportation Article. Exhibits included in the bill describe the City’s transportation priorities, including this Transit-Oriented Development designation, and depict the designated area.
