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# **HEARING NOTES**

# **Major Issues Discussed**

- 1. Chairman Conway called the hearing to order.
- 2. DC Worley reviewed recent crime statistics (Presentation in the file) Topics included:
  - a. Recent crime statics.
  - b. Distribution of car locks for brands of cars being stolen (Kia's and Hyundai's)
  - c. July 9th @ 7 am the new district boundaries take effect.
- 3. BPD then took questions from the committee members. Topics included:
  - a. Homicides and non-fatal shootings.
    - i. PC indicated that the Northern District seems to be having an anomalous year. And mentioned that this might be due to migrating criminal activity.
  - b. BPD looking into action plans to address increases in shootings. Items of review include
    - i. Deployment
    - ii. Identifying the type of violence group v single actor, retaliation for previous violence, etc...
    - iii. Working with community and governmental partners MONSE and Victim Services.
  - c. How to utilize force multipliers
    - i. BPD is looking to allocate more money for cameras -both city watch and home cameras.
    - ii. Reviewing and updating the microzone strategy
    - iii. Asking citizens to use 311 to report issues.
    - iv. Working with programs like the Downtown Partnership, Youth Curfew, Padlock, and Squeegee initiative.
  - d. Property crime
    - i. Issues with Kia and Hyundai cars being stolen
    - ii. Car-locks to be distributed at central locations (locations and times TBD)
  - e. Concerns about the new district boundaries
    - i. Planning for the new districts has been ongoing for several months and is now ready for the summer deployment.
  - f. Will the Maryland Supreme Court ruling on ballistic evidence make it harder to prosecute gun-related crimes?
    - i. The BPD is working with the crime lab on the issue and how experts can testify.
    - ii. The ruling itself is on unqualified opinions.
  - g. Gun Arrest
    - i. Up by 16
  - h. Mass Shooting in 4<sup>th</sup> district
    - i. 6 residents shot no fatalities.
    - ii. Councilmembers expressed concerns that this may be related to open-air drug markets which has been a concern of the community in the area.
      - 1. PC Worley noted deployment and staffing issues connected to that evening.
      - 2. Col Jones noted that the northern district has submitted the area of the shooting as a priority in their summer crime plan.
    - iii. PC Worley noted that the use of citations may help to address this type of crime in the future by connecting those using substances with services.

- 1. Council members expressed concern about over-enforcement.
- i. School Vandalism
  - i. 4<sup>th</sup> district new 21st-century school windows smashed, and playground ruined.
  - ii. MONSE Assistant Director Hoffman spoke about engagement that has happened so far this summer no minors have been transported to the centers but several incidents have been reported as having been curtailed by engagement on the ground with youth.
- j. Relationships between BPD and State Agencies.
  - i. CP Worley reports he has a good relationship with state troopers.
  - ii. State troopers, sheriff's offices, and transit officers have been used as resources in the city to help BPD with operations. This is in addition to working with offices like the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention.

## k. DAT Teams

- Councilman Cohen noted a Baltimore Magazine article that expressed several concerns about DAT units, linking them to prior plainclothes units and community disruption.
- ii. BPD noted that the key difference between DAT and prior units was the span of control which allowed for greater accountability. Other differences include:
  - 1. DAT is not plain clothes they do wear a uniform and are visible as police officers.
  - 2. Candidates are assessed by Command Staff.
  - 3. All arrests are reviewed.
- 1. Overtime funds
  - i. SAP grant from the Governor's office provides additional funds not from the City to help incentivize overtime.
- m. Catalytic converter theft
  - i. This has been a problem for nearly twenty years.
  - ii. Officers go to scrap yards to find sellers to help thieves and refer to the regional auto theft taskforce.
- n. Creation of the Citation Docket
  - i. BPD has worked with the State's Attorney's Office to create this.
  - ii. Officers will be able to assign court dates with the citation.
- 4. Chairman Conway recessed the hearing.
