**INTRODUCTION** - Port Covington Community Benefits District - Amendment - Boundaries

<u>PURPOSE/PLANS</u> - For the purpose of amending the boundaries of the Port Covington Community Benefits District.

<u>COMMENTS</u> – Council Bill 23-0400 seeks to amend the boundaries of the existing community benefits district located in Port Covington, serving Baltimore Peninsula. The establishment of the Port Covington Community Benefits District was enabled by the adoption of Ordinance 20-358. The amended boundaries proposed by Council Bill 23-0400, seeks to remove the former Locke Insulator parcel from the boundaries of the Port Covington Community Benefits District. The parcel to be removed is slated to be redeveloped for residential purposes and fees associated with a community benefits district are potentially cost prohibitive.
