#### AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

#### 1 Study and Report – Baltimore City Climate Resilience Authority 2 FOR the purpose of requiring the Director of Finance, the City Solicitor, the Director of 3 Transportation, the Director of Public Works, the Director of Planning, and the Director of Sustainability to submit a report detailing how Baltimore City may establish a local climate 4 resilience authority originally authorized by Chapter 236 of the Acts of 2020, now codified as 5 6 Title 22 {"Resilience Infrastructure"} of the State Local Government Article. 7 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That: (a) No later than 180 days after enactment of this Ordinance, the Director of Finance, the 8 City Solicitor, the Director of Transportation, the Director of Public Works, the 9 Director of Planning, and the Director of Sustainability shall submit a report detailing 10 how Baltimore City may establish a local climate resilience authority originally 11 authorized by Chapter 236 of the Acts of 2020, now codified as Title 22 {"Resilience 12 Infrastructure"} of the State Local Government Article. 13 (b) Prior to the report's final submission to the City Council a public notice shall be 14 published containing the report and seeking public comment for at least 30 days. 15 (c) The report shall include: 16 (i) A review of climate resilience authorities, including a review of: 17 (1) State enabling legislation; 18 19 (2) relevant Baltimore City law laws; and 20 (3) existing local climate resilience authorities in Maryland;

27 28	(1) continually assessing and using vulnerability data captured in the DP3 and NFP to:
29	(A) enhance local infrastructure resilience; and
30	(B) mitigate the environmental impacts of climate change;

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1	(2) supporting the implementation of initiatives and strategies outlined in
2	Citywide climate-related plans or exploring new initiatives that protect the
3	City's local infrastructure and environment; and
4	(3) incorporating climate mitigation and resilience strategies into the
5	implementation of current and future City projects to protect people, property,
6	and communities from the diverse effects of climate change.
7	(d) The City Council shall call a hearing where the Director of Finance, the City Solicitor
8	the Director of Transportation, the Director of Public Works, the Director of
9	Planning, and the Director of Sustainability shall present the findings and the
10	recommendations of the report.
11	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the day it is
12	enacted.
