> Re: City Council Bill 23-0423 – City Property – Renaming Cottage Avenue Park to Candy Stripe Park

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 23-0423 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would rename Cottage Avenue Park to Candy Stripe Park.

The Baltimore City Code allows for the naming of property by ordinance. City Code, Art. 5, § 20-2. There are no requirements for the name of real or personal property as there are for names of streets. Baltimore City Code, Art. 26, §7-1, *et. seq.* The bill that proposes the ordinance must be referred to the Planning Commission, the municipal agency that will have control over the City property, the Department of Real Estate and any other agency that has an interest in the property.

The First Reader version of this bill states that it was referred to the City Solicitor, Department of Finance, Planning Commission, Department of Recreation and Parks, Baltimore Development Corporation, Department of Transportation, and the Department of Real Estate. Assuming that the land is in control of one of these agencies, then it has been properly referred and the Law Department can approve it for form and legal sufficiency.
