The Department of Finance is herein reporting on City Council Bill 23-0426, Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation - M-R: Arts and Culture. The purpose of this legislation is to restore \$581,334 to Service 824: Events, Art, Culture, and Film, which supports the Baltimore Office of Promotion and the Arts (BOPA) budget.

## Background

As part of the Fiscal 2024 budget process, the City Council adopted an amendment to budget to reduce funding for BOPA by \$1,744,002. The amendment detailed four concern areas that needed to be addressed for funding to be restored:

- 1) BOPA's board governance and structure,
- 2) Operations of the Baltimore Film Office,
- 3) Operations of the Baltimore Arts Council and Public Arts Commission, and

4) BOPA's ability to carry out its mandate to produce events and festivals, administer grants, manage arts education and public art programming, provide film and production support, and provide oversight of Baltimore City facilities in its care.

The Administration and City Council have determined marked progress has been made in these areas in the time since 23-0177R was adopted. This Resolution seeks to restore \$581,334 in funding to BOPA in recognition that BOPA has complied with the requested actions of the City Council.

## **Fiscal Impact**

The Bureau of the Budget and Management Research is proposing to fund this supplemental appropriation through a projected surplus in transfer tax revenue. Despite increasing interest rates, the volume of activity in the real estate market remained strong into Fiscal 2023. Early projections for fiscal 2024 indicate these trends will continue generating a surplus in this revenue source.

It is anticipated there will be two additional supplemental requests to increase the Fiscal 2024 appropriation for BOPA. These supplementals will be timed with quarterly invoice submissions. These supplemental requests will be based on continued progress made in the areas identified above. Those items will continue to be assesses by the Administration and City Council.

## Conclusion

The Department of Finance has no objections to the proposed supplemental appropriation.
