- 2. Language access and accessibility of services to non-English-speaking residents.
- 3. The use of technology and human interpreters to bridge the language gap.
- 4. Plans for expanding language access services to other city agencies and public meetings.
- 5. Steps taken by different departments and agencies to ensure language access and inclusivity.
- 6. The importance of hiring and training bilingual staff, as well as promoting cultural competency among city employees, was a recurring topic.
- 7. The need for representation of the Latino community in city government and the recognition that it goes beyond just language access was highlighted.
- 8. Cultural competency training was highlighted as a key aspect of addressing language barriers, as it is crucial for public servants to understand and respect the diverse cultures of the residents they serve.
