#### Purpose:

For the purpose of inviting representatives from the Baltimore City Public School System, the Board of School Commissioners, and the Office of the Comptroller to brief the City Council on the reported shortage of athletic trainers in Baltimore City Schools, including a discussion of progress on the settlement agreement reached in 2022 to hire additional athletic trainers to prevent injury to student athletes at City schools.

#### Analysis

#### Background

The resolution aims to bring together representatives from key entities, such as the Baltimore City Public School System, the Board of School Commissioners, and the Office of the

Comptroller, to provide the City Council with insights into reported issues surrounding vendor payments. Specifically, the resolution calls for a discussion on delayed and unremitted payments to past vendors, shedding light on the challenges and potential shortcomings in the current system for the procurement and payment of vendors within City schools.
