Purpose:

For the purpose of calling on the <u>Directors</u> of the Finance Department's <u>Bureau of Budget and</u> <u>Management Research (BBMR)</u>, <u>Capital Budget</u> and the <u>Baltimore City Public School</u> to brief the City Council on how the City's actual finances compare to its budget projections.

Effective: On the 30th day after the date it is enacted

Analysis

Current Law

Baltimore City Code – Article 1, Subtitle 1-City Council, 1-6

§ 1-6. Agencies to provide legislative information.

It shall be the duty of the head of every City department or bureau established by the Baltimore City Charter or by ordinance to provide all technical materials, plats, drawings, and information that are requested by any member or the President of the City Council for the purpose of introducing legislation into the Council.

(City Code, 1976/83, art. 1, §6.) (Ord. 76-080.)

Background

<u>On Thursday, September 28, 2023,</u> representative(s) from the Bureau of Budget and Research Management (BBMR), the Planning Department, and Baltimore City Public Schools came before the committee to discuss <u>quarterly projections.</u>

Major Issues Discussed

- 1. The representatives from BBMR, Capital Budgeting and BCPS all gave a PowerPoint Presentation. Copies are on file. Following are notes from the hearing.
 - o <u>BBMR</u>
 - The representative gave a briefing regarding Fiscal Year 2023 Closeout.
 - She also stated that supplemental requests will be forthcoming for same.
 - o <u>Capital Budget</u>
 - The Presentation included information about the Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Year 2023
 - Including Budget Analysis and Expenses/Expenditures
 - Appendix Listing Capital Projects
 - o <u>BCPS</u>
 - Two representatives from the BCPS participated in giving the PowerPoint presentation.
 - One representative focused on Fiscal Year 2023 Fourth (4th) Quarter Budget Projection
 - The other representative talked about Fiscal Year 2023 Capital Funding, Spending and Requests.
- 2. Committee/council members asked questions, stated concerns, and made comments. Some highlighted topics of discussion, comments and/or concern were:
 - o <u>BBMR</u>
 - President Mosby stated, "the supplemental requests that will be forthcoming will be assigned to the Finance and Performance Committee and the supplementals submitted during the actual budget season will go to the Ways & Means Committee.
 - <u>Questions</u>:
 - How does your current projection compare to prior years?
 - <u>Overtime</u>
 - The overtime costs when compared to prior years; what was it? Answer: Will research and get back to you (Per Laura Larsen)
 - <u>Salary Savings</u>
 - What was the amount of savings from vacancies? Answer: Will research and get back to you (Per Laura Larsen)
 - Can an analysis of vacant positions be done?
 - What is the end result, revenue minus expenditures?

- <u>Sanitation fees</u>
 - How long have payments been delayed?
- Workday Issues
 - What other agencies were affected with billing issues?
- <u>Mayor's Office of Children and Family Success</u>
 - As a result of their deficit, what contracts did they contract out?
 - <u>Requested by Member McCray</u>: Submit information: a list of the vacant positions that cause the use of contractors.
 - Agencies who had Surpluses at the end of Fiscal Year 2023
 - Are these same agencies also projecting surpluses in Fiscal Year 2024?
- Expenditures for maintenance and/or repair for Real Property talk about this.
- Comments regarding the cost for snow removal last fiscal year being way under budget.
- <u>Transfer and Recordation Tax</u>
 - <u>Requested by Councilmember Ramos</u>: Submit by agency: the amount of surplus revenue received from the Transfer and Recordation Tax.

o Capital Budget

- Question(s)
 - How much was spent on PayGo last fiscal year?
- New Software
 - When you receive the new software, I would like to be able to capture multiyear projects?
 - On page 16 of the Presentation
 - The Summary of Capital Projects talk more about these projects and the current conditions of the projects.
 - Systemic versus Historic Projects
 - Talk about this and about the differences.
