Analysis

Changes to Current Law

Council bill 23-0418 introduces a new subtitle, titled "Subtitle 10. Tobacco Product Use in Stadiums," within the existing Article - Health of the Baltimore City Revised Code. The bill includes amendments with the addition of Sections 12-1001 to 12-1004, which provide definitions for terms like "Electronic Smoking Device," "Professional Sporting Event," "Tobacco Product," and "Stadium."

Background

The primary focus of this bill is to prohibit the use of tobacco products in any manner within stadiums. Enforcement mechanisms are outlined, allowing for citations issued by the Environmental Control Board or civil citations. Importantly, the issuance of a citation does not preclude the pursuit of other civil or criminal remedies. The bill establishes civil penalties of up to \$500 for each violation, with varying penalties for non-professional and professional sporting events. This proposed legislation aims to regulate and restrict tobacco product use in stadiums, promoting a healthier environment in these public spaces.

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 23-0418 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would add a Subtitle 10 Tobacco Product Use in Stadiums to Title 12 Tobacco Products and Smoking Devices of the Health Article of the Baltimore City Code. It defines stadium and tobacco products and prohibits the use of those products in stadia.

The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore's express powers granted by the General Assembly include the power to pass laws that promote the general welfare and expressly to "provide for the preservation of the health of all persons within the City." City Charter, Art. II, §§ (11)(a), (27), (47). Although "State law comprehensively regulates the packaging, sale and distribution of tobacco products, including cigars, and thus preempts this field," this does not preclude local government restrictions on places acceptable for smoking. *Altadis USA, Inc. v. Prince George's County*, 431 Md. 307, 316 (2013). In fact, the state's Clean Indoor Air Act explicitly provides that local governments may enact more strict measures. Md. Code, Health Gen., § 24-510.

Subtitles 7 and 8 of the Health Article of the City Code already prohibit smoking in certain areas. In fact, this bill's provisions overlap with existing prohibitions in Subtitle 8 for smoking within 50 feet of any athletic facility. City Code, Health Art., § 12-801. The bill would also overlap with any indoor facilities to the extent that those are already covered under the state's Clean Indoor Air Act. Md. Code, Health Gen., § 24-510. However, because this bill would not conflict with these existing laws, amendments are not needed, and the Law Department can approve the bill for form and legal sufficiency.

The Baltimore City Health Department (BCHD) is pleased to have the opportunity to review Council Bill 23-0418, entitled "Tobacco Products - Tobacco Product Use in Stadiums - Prohibition." This ordinance would prohibit the use of tobacco or nicotine products in stadiums, including but not limited to cigarettes, electronic smoking devices, and chewing tobacco. The ordinance would apply to all professional sporting events, including collegiate sporting and athletic events. The ordinance would not apply to high school or amateur sporting events for which the athletes do not receive payment.

BCHD recognizes the harmful health impacts of nicotine and tobacco use and supports efforts to discourage anyone – especially youth – from using tobacco and nicotine. BCHD's Tobacco Use Prevention and Cessation Program provides smoking cessation services, community education, school-based projects, and enforcement of retailer compliance with tobacco control ordinances. Additionally, our Bureau of Maternal and Child Health educates birthing parents and families about the importance of not smoking while pregnant and the harms of secondhand smoke on all family members, particularly infants and children.

While enforcement of this bill might be challenging, we believe that signage in the stadiums and other relevant locations will be an effective deterrent. Tobacco and nicotine use are harmful to public health, and young people in particular should be discouraged from using tobacco and should be protected from secondhand smoke. This ordinance would bring Baltimore City into accordance with other jurisdictions that have already taken similar measures. As such, BCHD requests a **favorable** position on Council Bill 23-0418.
