Major Issues Discussed

- 1. The primary focus of the hearing was on the environmental justice implications and public health concerns associated with medical waste incineration, particularly in the South Baltimore communities of Curtis Bay and Brooklyn.
- 2. Councilwoman Porter highlighted the dangers of toxic emissions from incinerators, including dioxins, heavy metals, and carcinogens, and emphasized the disproportionate impact on frontline communities.
- 3. Residents and advocates expressed concerns about the detrimental effects of incineration on air and water quality, as well as the overall quality of life in affected neighborhoods.
- 4. There was extensive discussion about the history of violations and environmental injustices related to the medical waste facility in South Baltimore.
- 5. Past incidents, such as illegal waste importation, bankruptcy filings due to pollution charges, and violations of emissions standards, were cited as evidence of ongoing environmental harm.
- 6. The community's advocacy efforts and resilience in documenting pollution incidents and pushing for accountability were highlighted as key factors in addressing these injustices.
- 7. Representatives from city agencies, including the Department of Public Works and the Baltimore City Health Department, clarified their limited roles in regulating and monitoring air quality and waste management facilities.
- 8. The hearing highlighted the importance of community monitoring efforts in documenting pollution incidents and holding polluters accountable.
- 9. Dr. Chris Heeney from Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health presented data analysis of pollution incidents captured through community monitoring using trail cameras.
- 10. The findings, including the frequency and duration of pollution events, underscored the need for greater transparency, regulatory oversight, and action to address environmental injustices and protect public health in affected communities.
