14	Article VI, § 9(a)(2) of the City Charter provides that, on recommendation of the Board of
15 16	Estimates, the City Council by ordinance may authorize the transfer of an appropriation contained in the Ordinance of Estimates from one municipal agency to another municipal agency.
17	The sum of \$1,514,351, as appropriated to the Department of General Services in the Fiscal
18	2024 Ordinance of Estimates, is not needed for the purpose for which it was appropriated and,
19	therefore, is available for transfer to another agency.
20	On February 5, 2025, the Board of Estimates recommended the transfer authorized by this
21	Ordinance.
22	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
23	sum of \$1,514,351, contained in the Fiscal 2024 Ordinance of Estimates as a General Fund
24	Operating Appropriation, is transferred from the Department of General Services to the
25	Department of Law (Service 861 - Controversies).
26	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is
27	enacted.
