AN ORDINANCE concerning 1 Sale of Property – 1407 Key Highway 2 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public 3 or private sale, all its interest in certain property known as 1407 Key Highway (Block 1998, 4 Lot 001) and no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date. 5 By authority of 6 Article V - Comptroller 7 Section 5(b) 8 9 **Baltimore City Charter** (1996 Edition) 10 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That, in accordance with Article V, § 5(b) of the City Charter, the City Comptroller may sell, at either 12 public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore in the property 13 known as 1407 Key Highway (Block 1998, Lot 001), and more particularly described as follows: 14 The subject parcel (Block 1998, Lot 001) is improved by a one-story plus balcony 15 building, containing approximately 39,369 square feet and an outbuilding 16 containing approximately 1650 square feet. The parcel is located on the east side 17 of Key Highway, east of the intersection of Webster Street and Key Highway, and 18 contains approximately 2.410 acres of land, of which 1.541 acres is fast land and 19 0.869 acres is submerged land. 20 21 22 The parcel is the current location of the City's Fire Department repair facility. This facility, along with the City's Central Garage/Fleet Maintenance facility, will 23

move to a new facility to be constructed at 3800 East Biddle Street. A portion of the proceeds from the sale of 1407 Key Highway will help fund the first phase of

the Center for Aquatic Life and Conservation (CALC), a major project to be
