4	For the purpose of congratulating Irma Johnson, Principal, Dallas F. Nicholas Elementary
5	School, on being named the 2007 Maryland Distinguished Principal of the Year by the
6	National Association of Elementary School Principals and commending her 32 years of
7	dedicated service to the Baltimore City Public School System; and providing for a special
8	effective date.
9	Recitals
10	The National Association of Elementary School Principals, founded in 1921, by a group of
11	51 principals seeking to promote their profession and to provide a national forum for their ideas,
12	today represents 30,000 elementary and middle school principals who are dedicated to ensuring
13	that all children get the best education possible and has become the most powerful voice of Pre-
14	K-8 principals across the United States and around the world.
15	The National Distinguished Principals Program was established in 1984, as an annual event
16	to honor exemplary elementary and middle school principals who set the pace, character, and
17	quality of the education children receive during their early school years. One principal is chosen
18	annually from each of the 50 states and the District of Columbia; principals representing private
19	K-8 schools, Department of Defense Dependent's Schools, and the U.S. Department of State
20	Overseas Schools are also eligible.
21	Public school principals are nominated by peers in their home states, and the final selection
22	for each state's National Distinguished Principal is made by the organization's affiliates, while
23	honorees from private schools and overseas schools are selected by special committees based on
24	the following criteria that the selected principal:
25	• is an active principal of a school in which a commitment is clearly evident through
26	programs designed to meet the academic and social needs of all students and through
27	firmly established community ties with parents and local business organizations;
28	 has been an active principal for at least 5 years;
29	• will be an active principal during the year in which he/she will receive the award:

1 2	 shows a strong commitment to the principalship through active membership in professional organizations;
3	• is respected by students, colleagues, parents, and the community at large;
4 5	 assumes an active role in his/her community, distinguishing himself/herself as a leader in civic, religious, or humanitarian activities;
6 7	 shows strong educational leadership by setting high expectations for school staff and students;
8	maintains an orderly, purposeful learning environment.
9 10 11 12 13 14	Ms. Irma Johnson began, in 1975, to demonstrate those qualities that ultimately led to her being honored with the Distinguished Principal Award, after receiving her undergraduate degree from the University of Maryland, College Park and beginning her teaching career as a primary special education teacher at George Street Elementary School. She continued her education with a Master's Degree from Coppin State University and is currently a Doctoral Candidate at Nova Southeastern University.
15 16 17	Ms. Johnson credits her life-long love of learning and educating others to a strong family background that emphasized the importance of education as personal wealth "that no one can take away".
