AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

City Streets – Closing – A Certain Street and Alleys Lying Within the Area Bounded by Pleasant Street, St. Paul Place, the Orleans Street Viaduct, and Calvert Street

- FOR the purpose of condemning and closing a certain street and alleys lying within the area
 bounded by Pleasant Street, St. Paul Place, the Orleans Street Viaduct, and Calvert Street, as
 shown on Plat 114-A-26A in the Office of the Department of Public Works; and providing

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the 16 Department of Public Works shall proceed to condemn and close a certain street and alleys lying 17 within the area bounded by Pleasant Street, St. Paul Place, the Orleans Street Viaduct, and

within the area bounded by Pleasant Street, St. Paul Place, theCalvert Street, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the north 19 side of Pleasant Street, 49.5 feet wide, and the west side of Hargrove Alley, 20 20 feet wide, said point of beginning being distant easterly 90.00 feet measured 21 along the north side of said Pleasant Street from the east side of St. Paul Place, 54 22 feet wide, and running thence binding on the west side of said Hargrove Alley, 23 Northerly 173.0 feet, more or less, to intersect the south side of Mulberry Street, 24 50 feet wide; thence binding on the south side of said Mulberry Street, Easterly 25 20.0 feet to intersect the east side of said Hargrove Alley; thence binding on the 26 27 east side of said Hargrove Alley, Southerly 173.0 feet, more or less, to intersect

the north side of said Pleasant Street, and thence binding on the north side of said
 Pleasant Street, Westerly 20.0 feet to the place of beginning.

Beginning for Parcel No. 2 at the point formed by the intersection of the east side 3 of St. Paul Place, 54 feet wide, and the north side of Mulberry Street, 50 feet 4 wide, and running thence binding on the north side of said Mulberry Street, on the 5 line of the north side of said Mulberry Street, if projected easterly, and in all, 6 7 Easterly 116.0 feet, more or less, to intersect the east side of Hargrove Alley, 20 feet wide; thence binding on the east side of said Hargrove Alley, Southerly 50.0 8 feet to intersect the line of the south side of said Mulberry Street, if projected 9 easterly; thence binding reversely on the line of the south side of said Mulberry 10 Street, so projected, on the south side of said Mulberry Street, and in all, Westerly 11 12 110.0 feet, more or less, to intersect the east side of said St. Paul Place, and thence binding on the east side of said St. Paul Place, Northerly 50.3 feet, more or 13 less, to the place of beginning. 14

Beginning for Parcel No. 3 at the point formed by the intersection of the north 15 16 side of Mulberry Street, 50 feet wide, and the east side of St. Paul Place, 54 feet wide, and running thence binding on the east side of said St. Paul Place, Northerly 17 54.7 feet, more or less, to intersect the south side of The Orleans Street Viaduct, 18 varying in width; thence binding on the south side of said Orleans Street Viaduct, 19 Easterly 96.0 feet, more or less, to intersect the west side of Hargrove Alley, 20 20 feet wide; thence binding on the west side of said Hargrove Alley, Southerly 52.5 21 feet, more or less, to intersect the north side of said Mulberry Street, and thence 22 binding on the north side of said Mulberry Street, Westerly 96.0 feet, more or 23 less, to the place of beginning. 24

Beginning for Parcel No. 4 at the point formed by the intersection of the west side 25 of a 3 foot alley, laid out in the rear of the properties formerly known as No. 343 26 and No. 345 St. Paul Place, and the south side of Mulberry Street, 50 feet wide, 27 28 said point of beginning being easterly 64.8 feet, more or less, measured along the south side of said Mulberry Street from the east side of St. Paul Place, 54 feet 29 wide, and running thence binding on the south side of said Mulberry Street, 30 Easterly 3.0 feet to intersect the east side of said 3 foot alley; thence binding on 31 the east side of said 3 foot alley, Southerly 50.0 feet, more or less, to the 32 southernmost extremity of said 3 foot alley; thence binding on the southernmost 33 extremity of said 3 foot alley, Westerly 3.0 feet to intersect the west side of said 3 34 foot alley, and thence binding on the west side of said 3 foot alley, Northerly 50.0 35 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning. 36

Beginning for Parcel No. 5 at the point formed by the intersection of the north 37 side of Mulberry Street, 50 feet wide, and the west side of Hargrove Alley, 20 feet 38 wide, said point of beginning being distant easterly 96.0 feet, more or less, 39 measured along the north side of said Mulberry Street from the east side of St. 40 Paul Place, 54 feet wide, and running thence binding on the west side of said 41 42 Hargrove Alley, Northerly 18.1 feet, more or less; thence by a straight line drawn at a right angle to the west side of said Hargrove Alley, Easterly 20.0 feet to 43 intersect the east side of said Hargrove Alley; thence binding on the east side of 44 said Hargrove Alley, Southerly 18.1 feet, more or less, to intersect the north side 45 of said Mulberry Street, and thence binding on the north side of said Mulberry 46 Street, Westerly 20.0 feet to the place of beginning. 47

As delineated on Plat 114-A-26A, prepared by the Survey Control Section and filed on

2 September 6, 2007, in the Office of the Department of Public Works.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the proceedings for the condemnation and 4 closing of the street and alleys and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in 5 accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and 6 regulations adopted by the Director of Public Works and filed with the Department of 7 Logislative Pederance

8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all 9 subsurface structures and appurtenances now owned by the Mayor and City Council of 10 Baltimore continue to be the property of the Mayor and City Council, in fee simple, until their 11 use has been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council. If any person wants to remove, alter, or 12 interfere with them, that person must first obtain permission from the Mayor and City Council 13 and, in the application for this permission, must agree to pay all costs and expenses, of every 14 kind, arising out of the removal, alteration, or interference.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no building or structure of any kind (including but not limited to railroad tracks) may be constructed or erected in or on any part of the street closed under this Ordinance until all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council or, at the expense of the person seeking to erect the building or structure, have been removed and relaid in accordance with the specifications and under the direction of the Director of Public Works of Baltimore City.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all
 subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by any person other than the Mayor and City
 Council of Baltimore shall be removed by and at the expense of their owners, promptly upon
 notice to do so from the Director of Public Works.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That at all times after the closing under this Ordinance, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by or through its authorized representatives, shall have access to the subject property and to all subsurface structures and appurtenances used by the Mayor and City Council, for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining, repairing, altering, relocating, or replacing any of them, without need to obtain permission from or pay compensation to the owner of the property.

32 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it 33 is enacted.
